

BUT ONE STATION WOULD BE NEEDED

One pumping station, and that located at the foot of Madison st., and two north and south mains, one on Western av. and one on Third av. would be amply sufficient to provide auxiliary salt water main system for additional fire protection for Seattle, in the opinion of Superintendent Youngs of the water department, who has made a detailed study of the subject.

Centrally Located.
"The pumping plant for such a system should be centrally located, say at the foot of Madison st."

These two mains should be connected by cross mains on every street with hydrants on each corner. With a chart of the system and a pressure gauge before him the man in charge of the pumps at the pumping plant could tell at all times what the pressure was at every hydrant on the system. There should be a connection with the fresh water mains so that when not in use the system could be emptied of salt water and flushed and kept full of fresh water. Such a system would supply all the water we could possibly use on a fire of any kind in Seattle, completely flooding the buildings which should break into flames.

said Superintendent Youngs this morning, "and should have connections with all the electric power plants in the city by underground conduits. The pumping plant should have a capacity of say two and one-half times the capacity of the present Cedar River pipe line. From the pumping plant there should be a 20-inch main up the hill to Third av. with 20-inch north and south mains on Third av. and Western av. running north to Virginia and south to Jackson.


