SUICIDES AFTER TRYING TO MURDER

TACOMA MAN, MAD WITH JEALOUSY, FIRES FIVE SHOTS AT GIRL AND COMPANION, THEN TURNS GUN ON HIMSELF.

TACOMA, Aug. 16.—Maddened by jealousy, Peter Reynard, 54 years old, armed himself last night with two 38-caliber revolvers and sought pretty 17-year-old Emma Fox and her companion, Robert Corey. The young couple had attended a party and were returning home through N. 30th st. When near Starr st. Reynard confronted them. The crazed man fired five shots at the girl and her companion and then turned the weapon on himself. Miss Fox received ugly wounds in the right arm and body, and Corey was burned by powder. Reynard's first shot at himself took effect in his head and he died almost instantly.

Reynard, who was about 54 years of age, had been employed by the firm of McCabe & Hamilton, and had for five years boarded at the home of Miss Fox's step-father, Harry Dickman, at 2216 N. 30th st. Reynard was madly in love with the young girl and resented the attentions of other men in that quarter.
