TEAM CHARGES EXORBITANT

ARBITRARY SCALE OF PRICES ADOPTED AND ENFORCED BY SEATTLE TEAMSTERS' ASSOCIATION IS FIXED WITHOUT REGARD TO DISTANCE.

Under the arbitrary scale of prices for teaming adopted and enforced by the Seattle Teamsters' association, the charge for delivering coal and wood is fixed without regard to the distance which fuel has to be hauled or the time necessary to perform the service.

The method adopted for the establishment of teaming rates is to divide the city into districts, the charge being the same for delivery in each district, regardless of the distance to be covered.
