

### NEW WATER BONDS TO BE ISSUED

Bond buyers are not likely to move for bonds of the city of Seattle than they will ever do. Saturday for the purchase of the \$2,500,000 issue of water bonds, which would have happened at the late call, when bids were received on the park and sewer bonds.

The call that, when the bonds were issued, ten years must elapse before any payments could be made on the principal, whereas the state statute specifically requires that from the very beginning a certain specified proportion of the income to be derived from the sale of water must be applied to the payment of interest and to the redemption of the bonds.
