

# AMERICAN IS TORTURED IN A GERMAN CELL

(By United Press.)  
KARLSRUHE, Germany, July 17.—That he killed his mother-in-law, Frau Molitor, during a "brainstorm" will probably be the plea of Karl Hau, the young professor formerly a member of the faculty of George Washington university, Washington, D. C., who was placed on trial today. Despite the fact that Hau has been examined and pronounced sane by a commission of alienists, the theory of mental irresponsibility will almost certainly be brought forward by the defense. This is evidenced by the fact that Hau's attorneys have engaged Prof. Schaffner of Cologne to testify in the case. Sensational charges against the German police in the matter of

Hau's treatment since his incarceration in the prison here have been made by his American friends and may be aired during the trial. It is alleged that the officers have used every method of diabolical torture in their efforts to make the youthful professor confess to having murdered his wife's mother at Baden-Baden last November. Hau's chances of being acquitted have been greatly lessened by the suicide of his wife, who drowned herself near Zurich several weeks ago. Her act is generally construed to have been due to a belief in her husband's guilt. In a note left by the woman she stated that she still loved Hau, in spite of his deed, but that she could not bear to continue living while he had such a stain upon his soul.

# NEW MAYOR FOR FRISCO

SAN FRANCISCO, July 17.—This city has another mayor. Last night Dr. Edward R. Taylor, physician and lawyer, dean of the Hastings law school of the University of California, was elected by the board of supervisors, and by the open avowal of the bribery-graft prosecution the so-called "Reign of the big stick" came to an end. Dr. Taylor is the third man to whom the election was offered by Rudolph Spreckles and District Attorney William H. Langdon. His election came as a complete surprise to the city, for at no time in the past weeks of daily guessing was his name mentioned by anyone outside of the secret councils of the district attorney and his half dozen associates. The office was tendered Dr. Taylor a few minutes after 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon, and his acceptance was in the hands of Mr. Langdon and Mr. Spreckles before 5 o'clock. Dr. Taylor is between 60 and 65 years old. But the trouble is not over. Battleship Nebraska at navy yard.

# CARELESSNESS NOT THE CAUSE

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 17.—Carelessness on the part of any one of the 22 men in the aft turret on the battleship Georgia did not cause the explosion which proved fatal to nine. A thorough investigation being made has demonstrated this fact. In the absence of any other plausible explanation, the officials here are disposed to give consideration to the theory advanced by some of the Georgia's officers when they came ashore at Boston, that the powder charge of the eight-inch gun was fired accidentally by a clot of soot, which came floating down smoldering from the ship's smoke pipe and settled by chance into the open scuttle on top of the turret, alighting directly on the 50-pound bag of powder in the arms of the loader at the breech of the gun. # BUILDING COLLAPSES

LONDON, Ont., July 17.—Crystal hall, a three-story brick building on Dundas st., one of the landmarks of this place, collapsed late yesterday afternoon and nine were killed, two are missing and scores are in the hospitals from injuries. The building was being remodeled. A number of old supports had been taken out and iron ones were being installed when the crash came. Workmen and tenants were hurled into a heap. Confusion reigned and for a time rescue work was impossible. Men, women and children were imprisoned beneath the debris, and not until late last night were all rescued. A thorough search of the ruins is being made today and the responsibility will also be fixed.
