

# ANNUAL GRAND JURY NEEDED IN SEATTLE

### Dr. M. A. Matthews Advocates Its Adopting in Address Last Night—Able, Fearless Prosecutor Also Needed—Cites Instances of Lawlessness.

Necessity of a constitutional amendment providing for an annual grand jury was the principal point brought out by Rev. M. A. Matthews, in his address before the New club of the Queen Anne neighborhood church last night.

He advocated a grand jury as a clean, capable, fearless body to investigate, to prosecute, to give its whole time to the prevention of crime and corruption in the city.

On the Saturdays preceding, delivery wagons of the Seattle Brewing & Malting company were seen to carry large supplies of fermented liquors to the club houses, and the succeeding Mondays they have been seen taking empty bottles and barrels home, away from the club house.

It is said by citizens of Georgetown that Mayor John Muller, as manager of the Seattle Brewing & Malting company is aware of the existence of the Country Inn club from Monday until the following Saturday. But, as head of the police department, he is ignorant of its existence from 12 o'clock Saturday night until 12 o'clock Sunday night.

The club started with only a membership of four—Robb, Reber, and Morris. Since the only days on which new members have been elected have been Sundays, August 19 and 25. The four original incorporators are on hand early in the day and remain until late at night.


