AMERICA'S CHAMPION GIRL PITCHER HAS CANNON BALL CURVES

VERMILION, Ohio, Sept. 30.—The champion girl pitcher of America is Miss Alta Weiss, of the semi-professional ball team of this place. Can a woman throw straight?

You bet this little woman can! Just a slip of a girl and frail looking, Miss Alta has pitched for Vermilion against the strongest semi-professional teams of the state, and she won her game every time. She has a record of striking out 15 men in one game and never allows her opponents more than six or seven hits. Often she holds them down to four or five.

Superb control is her forte. She seldom passes a batter, and in addition to rifle-like speed, she has a fine assortment of shots and curves. She is the only pitcher of extraordinary ability, but a clever batter. She stands close to the plate and makes the pitcher put them over. She refuses to bite on wide ones, and when she goes after the ball does so with a quick, sharp stab that would make many a minor leaguer green with jealousy.

Miss Weiss plays in a gymnasium suit, the skirt reaching to her ankles. This is a handicap every ball player can appreciate, and next season she will adopt either a bloomer suit or short skirts. Nevertheless, she fields her position admirably. The showy windup of many professional pitchers is conspicuous by its absence, when Miss Weiss works. She wastes no time, but shoots the ball to the plate overhand or underhand, with no hesitation of shoots and curves.

Base runners have little chance to steal on the clever girl pitcher. Before the fifth round was through both men were covered with crimson, Squires' mouth being a mass of raw flesh and Sullivan's right eye being split and pouring blood in great shape. There were innumerable clinches and the men when in a tight place, often wrestled. In the 15th and 16th rounds Sullivan nearly lost the decision on stomach fouts but each time the men shook hands and smiled at each other.

Squires contemplates going east to arrange several six-round goes if he can secure the proper backing and sign with the proper men. The fight was a bloody one and the crowd got its money's worth in the blood line.
