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OREGONIAN THROWS DOWN THE REPUBLICAN PARTY

Caustic Editorial Appears in Which Portland Paper Announces Future Independence.

(By United Press.) PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 29.—In a caustic editorial this morning the Oregonian formally announced its complete divorce from the republican party organization in the state, and declares that in the future it would discuss political policy from the standpoint of an independent newspaper.

The editorial reads as follows: "The Oregonian has done what it could to support the republican party of Oregon. Republicans have not responded. They can now and henceforward support their party themselves, if they desire to do so. Like Romeo at the play, the Oregonian will be a candle-holder and look on. It is tired of the effort to appeal on principles, political, social, financial, national and historic, to men who don't care for anything of the kind, but are actuated merely by selfish piques, party desires and trifling personal ambitions."
