

WOMAN KILLED BY DEVIL FASTERS

CHICAGO, June 23.—Following

the allegation that she was starved to death by the "devil fasters," the police are today making an investigation of the circumstances surrounding the demise of Mrs. Louisa Thompson, wife of the Rev. Adam Thompson, of the new cult at Zion City.

Mrs. Thompson was possessed of the devil and she was submitted to the fasting treatment by which they hold it is possible to "expel devils." The police have been informed that the woman went forty-one days without food of any kind or a drop of water.

According to the story, when she begged for a morsel of food or a drop of water, crying out that she was being gnawed to death by the pangs of hunger and burning up with thirst, the watchers refused, saying: "Hold out a little longer, dear sister, and the evil one will be defeated."
