

# PRESIDENT OF EAGLES HAS ARRIVED IN SEATTLE

### Theodore A. Bell, Head of the Order Is Welcomed With a Band.

Theodore A. Bell, grand worthy president of the Fraternal Order of Eagles, arrived in Seattle over the Northern Pacific at 4 o'clock this afternoon. He was met by the degree team of Seattle Aerie, No. 1, which, with a band, escorted him to the Washington Annex, where he will make his headquarters while in Seattle.

Mr. Bell gained a national reputation by the manner in which, as temporary chairman, he handled the democratic convention at Denver last month. In 1902 Mr. Bell was elected grand trustee of the Eagles. In 1906 he was elected vice president at the Milwaukee convention, and in 1907 succeeded to the presidency at the Norfolk convention.

Succession Is Fixed. While there is little talk of Order politics among the delegates, it is conceded by all that Treasurer Frank E. Hering will succeed to the vice presidency left vacant when Bernard J. Monaghan of Philadelphia graduates into the presidency. No opposition has developed to Conrad H. Mann, the present secretary of the order, and he will undoubtedly be re-elected. William Gartland of Boston and Finlay McRae of Helena, Mont., are the only candidates in sight for the position of treasurer, with present indications slightly favoring Mr. Gartland.

Omaha in the Lead. Omaha is practically assured the 1909 convention, the advertising scheme adopted by Delegate Tuttle doing much towards creating a strong sentiment for the "Geographical Center of the United States." Many of the delegates regretted that the convention could not be held again in Seattle next year, as the beautiful summer climate of the city is a long lane of red, white and blue streamers, while "Welcome" flags and pennants are in evidence everywhere. Seattle merchants are outdoing themselves and already the city is decorated far better than it was for the coming of the fleet.

The merchants have also responded liberally to the request that the stores be closed during the hours of the parade.



# STEAMER BURNED

### Six Passengers Lose Their Lives and Two of Crew Perish in Flames.

WINNIPEG, Man., Aug. 8.—The steamer Premier, Captain Stevens, was burned to the water's edge at Warner's landing, the northern terminus of Lake Winnipeg, on Thursday morning. Six passengers and two of the crew lost their lives. Docks and other buildings in the vicinity were also destroyed. About 20 were sleeping on board when the fire broke out. When the cry of "fire" was raised those who escaped did so in scanty attire by jumping overboard, when they either swam to shore or were picked up by boats.

Reports last today indicate that Capt. Wood, of the destroyed ship Premier, was the hero of the fire. Healing the danger to his passengers, he rushed into the hold and carried out several kegs of powder just as the flames were bursting into the compartment where the explosive was stored. Had the powder ignited, the ship would have been blown to pieces and the lives of all on board would have been sacrificed.

# BOUILLON DELAYS INVESTIGATION

### Council Committee Awaits Information on Street Car Fenders.

Because of his continued delay in making any report on the street car fender investigation, which was referred to him many weeks ago by the city council committee, A. V. Bouillon, superintendent of the department of public utilities, will probably be called to task by the special council committee to which the matter was first referred. Mr. Bouillon has been called upon several times for a report, but he simply excused the apparent neglect with a statement that he was still "waiting" for information from the east. This information apparently consisted of replies to letters which he had written to eastern firms that manufacture street car fenders.

## ATLANTIC FLEET AT AUCKLAND SUNDAY

Will Arrive There Early in the Forenoon—Speed of Fleet Is Increased.

AUCKLAND, New Zealand, Aug. 8.—A wireless from the Atlantic fleet today says: "The gale blew itself out last night. The weather is fine now. We will arrive at Auckland at 8 o'clock Sunday morning."

The speed of the fleet has been increased to 11 knots, so as to bring the vessels into the harbor on time. It was announced today that the rifle match between the New Zealanders and Americans had been canceled because the law prevents the landing of any foreign armed force on British soil. Premier Sir Joseph Ward declared that he could not allow such a thing. The book printed by the government to be presented to the officers of the fleet as a memento of the fleet's visit to New Zealand, was finished today. It is handsomely embossed. In the preface it declares that no visit of foreign warships is as welcome as this visit of the American armada.

The name of Theodore Roosevelt stands for national righteousness everywhere, says the book, "and is honored and revered. The American fleet stands for justice, peace and freedom." Although there will be no celebration here on the day of the American fleet's arrival, which is the Sabbath, the occasion will be one never to be forgotten. Auckland realized that New Zealand will be the first British possession to welcome the great armada from across the Pacific ocean, and plans never exceeded for celebration have been in preparation for months. Festivities of all sorts, from formal banquets by the government to the officers of the fleet, to boxing matches for the blue jackets have been arranged. The parliament has appropriated \$25,000 for the celebration and the local merchants have raised an additional \$15,000. Monday morning will be given over to the landing of the fleet's officers and the official reception. In the afternoon a grand parade of Auckland troops and the fleet sailors and marines will occupy the time, and a grand state banquet is to be held in the evening.
