

MAKES KITTINGER ADMINISTRATOR

George B. Kittinger was yesterday appointed by Judge Morris administrator of the estate of A. M. Springer. Prosper Ralston, who filed an objection to the appointment of Kittinger, did not appear in court to pursue his objections. Springer died at Prosser while on the recent Chamber of Commerce excursion, and his body, in the absence of any known relatives, was taken charge of by the organization and brought back to Seattle, and, at the request of the Chamber, Mr. Kittinger was appointed special administrator. Yesterday he was appointed general administrator of the estate.

The estate is reported by the administrator to be worth about \$60,000, with debts against it of \$33,750. The administrator has incurred liabilities of \$52.26. The known debtors consist of James Springer, Sanzsky, O. Benjamin Springer, Crestline, O. Byron Springer, Glenn Valley, Ont., John Springer, Muskota, Ont., Moses Springer, address unknown, all brothers, Sarah Springer, Brooklyn, N. Y., and Mrs. C. Corcoran, Kenora, O. There is also a nephew and niece.

ALBUQUERQUE, Oct. 22.—Cochilla county has begun work collecting a large exhibit for the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition.


Receiver Appointed.


