GREAT LEGAL BATTLE

Calhoun Will Have Array of Talent to Defend Him in Trial.

(By United Press.) SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 15.—The approaching trial of Patrick Cal-

houn, president of the United Railroads, on a charge of offering a bribe to Supervisor Fred P. Nicholas, to secure a favorable vote on an overhead trolley franchise, is expected to become one of the greatest battles between leading attorneys in the history of California. It is reported today that Garrett Melnery will join in the defense of Calhoun together with A. A. Moore of this city, and Earl Rogers, of Los Angeles. The Citizens' League of Justice, in view of the imposing array for the defense, will ask Hiram Johnson to aid Francis J. Heney, District Attorney William H. Langdon and Assistant District Attorney John O'Gara in prosecuting the trolley magnate.
