

CAR TRUST NEEDS MONEY MAYOR; BUT QUAKERS DEFY 3c FARE GRAB

CIVIC REVOLUTION THREATENED IN PHILADELPHIA—PEOPLE WALK RATHER THAN PAY 5-CENT FARE AND 3-CENT TRANSFER—EXCITED TOWN MEETINGS DENOUNCE POLITICAL TRAITORS.

PHILADELPHIA, May 25.—Poor old Philadelphia is having another desperate fight with its mayor, John E. Reuberg, in order to find out who was right in the struggle. "I asked the mayor, John E. Reuberg, 'Who's on top? You or the people?'" said the mayor proudly. "You see, he confesses that he's on top," said the people. "The people are wrong."

And it does look as if the mayor, backed by the moneyed interests of Philadelphia, will win and raise the street car fares and take \$2,000,000 out of the pockets of the people and put it in the coffers of the Philadelphia Rapid Transit Co.
