

THEATRE IS READY FOR THE OPENING

Mrs. Fiske Will Appear Tonight on the Stage of the New Alhambra Before a Crowded House.

With practically everything complete, including the sale of tickets, the new Alhambra theatre will be formally opened at 8:30 tonight, when the first curtain rises and Mrs. Fiske, in "Salvation Nell," presents to Seattle one of the most realistic plays ever shown on the American stage.

Flushing the boxes were being put on the inside of the building this morning, and men were at work getting the new theatre its first thorough cleaning. The carpets were laid today, and the electric light globes were put in place. The stage girders arrived this morning, and members of the company, who came yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock, got their mail this morning.

The scenery in "Salvation Nell" bears the reputation of being the most realistic ever put on the stage, not only on the coast, but everywhere. The street scene, it is said, is the best portrayal of the slums ever presented.

A long chain of eager patrons stood in line this morning in order to engage their seats. The sale for the entire week will be unusually large, and it is not unlikely, according to the managers, that this house will be sold out every night.


Passenger Goes into Ditch.
