GEORGETOWN COUNCIL NOW TAKES ACTION

Makes Stringent Laws to Regulate Saloons and Revokes the Licenses of Three Roadhouses.

Anticipating the move of the sheriff's office, the council of the city of Georgetown last night passed an ordinance prohibiting the sale of intoxicating liquors to women, except in dining rooms and restaurants. At the same meeting they also revoked the licenses of the three houses where the recent "joy ride" party purchased their liquor. Another ordinance provides for the closing of bars at 1 o'clock a. m.

"If the county cares to police this city, all right," said Mayor Mueller, "but they will be going to a needless expense, because we are going to have more stringent ordinances here than you have in Seattle." This statement followed the announcement from Sheriff Robert T. Hodges' office that they would place a squad of deputies in Georgetown and enforce the law in every particular.

The places closed by the Georgetown marshal last night and which have no longer a license to sell liquor in that city, are the S. & S. bar, run by James L. Elam; the Horseshoe saloon, run by Charles Ufen, and the Jones place, run by George E. Jones.

Besides the bartenders of the roadhouses who were arrested and whose trials will come up next Friday, warrants have now been issued for the arrest of the proprietors, and two have already been placed in custody. They are George E. Jones and Charles Ufen. James L. Elam is in the East and he will be arrested immediately upon his arrival. The men are now out on \$1,000 bonds.

NEW GOVERNOR OF MINNESOTA

Adolph O. Eberhardt, by succeeding John Albert Johnson as governor of Minnesota, restores control of the state to the Republican party for the first time in five years. Though Minnesota has had a Republican legislature and Republican state officers, the extraordinary success of Gov. Johnson has given the Democrats control of the executive branch of the government since 1904.
