

VETERANS AND A VISIT BY PRESIDENT

Go to the Soldiers' Home at Sawtelle—Off Tonight on the Last Leg of His Swing.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Oct. 12.—The president did not retire until late last night because of a special given in his honor at the Soldiers' Home at Sawtelle, near Los Angeles, today and ready to start early through the citrus belt of Southern California.

The president, accompanied by his entire party, boarded the electric car and was whisked to the Veterans' Home at Sawtelle. After his inspection of the grounds, he boarded the car and went to Hollywood, where the president's automobiles were waiting for the party, and their trip to Los Angeles was made by the same cars carried to Pasadena and his followers to Pasadena where he arrived at 11:30, where the last leg of his journey tonight.

PUBLIC WAITING END OF FIGHT

Little Hope of Opening of S. R. & S. Fourth Av. Line in Near Future.

While the officials of the Seattle Electric and Seattle, Renton & Southern railways are still in a squabble over the selection of a third arbitrator to settle differences affecting the Fourth av. line of the latter corporation, merchants along that thoroughfare and residents in the vicinity of Renton are impatiently waiting for some action to be taken.

For many weeks the Seattle, Renton & Southern road has had tracks laid on Fourth av. between Pike and Washington sts. In order to connect this line with its tracks in Rainier av. it must use the tracks of the Seattle Electric company for one block on Fourth av. S. between Washington and Main sts.

The question that arises is how much the Renton line should pay for the use of these tracks. To settle this question an arbitration board was suggested. J. D. Blackwell has been selected to represent the Seattle, Renton & Southern road and W. D. Woodard will act in a similar capacity for the other line.

The hitch now is over the selection of a third arbitrator.

JUMPS TRACK AT TUNNEL ENTRANCE

The Great Northern Overland No. 3, carrying the mail from St. Paul, jumped the track this afternoon at the tunnel entrance at the foot of Virginia st.

The engine of the train ran into an open switch. Only the first three cars were derailed.

JURORS WILL TAKE NO ONE'S WORD FOR KIND OF WHISKY.

TIVERTON, R. I., Oct. 12.—The finding of the severed limbs of a woman in a dress suit case among some bushes in an outlying section of this town has brought to light what the authorities are convinced is a case of murder.

A New Bedford newspaper of Sunday's date was with the limbs. The police believe the woman was murdered in New Bedford, and that the limbs were placed in the suit case and brought here.

Dr. John Simmons, who examined the legs, said the work of mutilation was accomplished with a hand saw.

A search for the other portions of the body in the woods nearby was made. Bulgermarch road, on which the suit case was found, is much used by automobile parties.

"As jurors in this case," the questioner continued, "we swore to not consider anything but the evidence as produced on the stand. The evidence shows that the Indian purchased the gallon demijohn, but nothing has been introduced to show that it contains whisky."


