TORTURE FOR WOMEN WHO SEEK TO VOTE

Women in Prisons in the English Country Forced to Undergo Barbarous Treatment.

LONDON, Oct. 27.—Queer things are leaking out concerning the treatment of the suffragettes undergoing terms of imprisonment in English jails for attempting to force the government into acceding to the franchise on equal terms with men.

ARE TORTURED.

The prison officials' method, where possible, is to insert the feeding tube through one of the subject's nostrils. In every case where the tube has been used, the suffragettes say, the nostril has quickly become so inflamed that it was necessary to use the other one, and when this too has been completely stopped up, to put the tube down the prisoner's throat.

METHOD ENDS IN DEATH.
