CATCH P. O. CLERK ROBBING THE MAIL

(By United Press.) SPOKANE, Wash., Oct. 28.—Peering through "lookout" holes in the postoffice walls, four inspectors watched George H. Coonce, city distributing clerk, last night till he had hidden thirty letters in his pockets. Then they sprang out of hiding, chased the fleeing clerk and captured him. Coonce confessed he began stealing letters last July, when he failed to get an advance in salary which he thought was due. He says he stole more than \$1,000 in cash, burning letters, money orders and checks in a stove at his home. For months the authorities have been tracing the loss of many letters.

MILLIONS WILL BE SPENT BY RAILROAD

(By United Press.) NEW YORK, Oct. 28.—President W. C. Brown of the New York Central & Hudson River railway, announced today that the management had entered upon a campaign of extraordinary expenditures to meet extraordinary traffic demands. The company had placed contracts in the last few days, he said, for \$25,000,000 worth of new locomotives, passenger and freight cars, and intends to spend \$60,000,000 more—\$85,000,000 in all—in reducing grades, straightening curves and laying new rails, exclusive of \$50,000,000 terminal improvements in New York.

Y., in connection with an alleged shortage of \$499 in his accounts with the Merchants' Express company. Adams was traced to Seattle through correspondence with his friends at Mt. Vernon.

In a recent magazine article he speaks of himself as "an elderly gentleman, whose varied past includes rheumatism." President Taft was 52 years of age on September 15. Mr. Roosevelt's friends here took no formal note of the day.
