WILL DEDICATE MOST BEAUTIFUL MASONIC CATHEDRAL IN COUNTRY

FORT WAYNE, Ind., Nov. 15.—Masons here and all over the country declare that the Scottish Rite cathedral, to be dedicated here next Wednesday with impressive ceremonies, is the most beautiful and best higher Masonic building in the country, if not in the whole world. Masonry conversant with organization homes bear out this statement. Certain it is that the structure is wonderfully graceful and imposing. It cost \$150,000, the money being contributed by Masons in this jurisdiction. In the basement of the building are billiard and bowling rooms, furnaces, etc.; on the second floor is a monster banquet hall, capable of seating 1,900 persons. The third floor is occupied entirely by the lodge and social rooms, while on the fourth floor is the monster auditorium, with regulation size stage and seats arranged around a big working space in the style of a Roman amphitheatre. This auditorium is declared to be unexcelled. Present at the dedication will be thousands of Masons from all parts of the United States. The consecration ceremonies will be in charge of Barton Smith, 33d degree, of Toledo, the second highest Mason in America, the honor having been delegated to him by Samuel Crocker Lawrence, 33d degree, of Boston, the highest Mason in the country, who is unable to attend the event because of illness. Wm. Geake, 33d degree Mason, of this city, head of the local Scottish Rite, the highest Mason in Indiana, and a member of the country's supreme council, has charge of arrangements for the dedication.

MADAME STEINHEIL HIDES IN COUNTRY

The Automobile club of Seattle will hold its regular meeting this evening at 8 o'clock in the Rainier club and officers for the coming year will be elected.


