

SCHOOL BOYS HOLLER FOR JUDGE MOORE

Politics has invaded the ranks of pupils of the Seattle public schools, and Moore and Gill partisans, from 10 to 15 years old, are doing their part in the campaign for mayor.

The Summit school is a center of schoolboy political activity, the boys being divided into Gill and Moore camps, according to the politics of their parents.

The Moore camp in the Summit school, under the leadership of Sidney Jenkins and Webster Rusk, is striving to put one over the Gill camp by holding a downtown night-shirt parade Saturday evening preceding the Moore rally which will be held at the Seattle theatre. Wearing white "nighties" and carrying Moore banners, the boys, some 30 in number, will parade up and down Second and Third ays. from 6 o'clock until 8 o'clock, ending up at the Seattle theatre.

Two slogans have been prepared by Webster Rusk, the poetical genius of the school, and they will be shouted by the boys during the parade. The leading slogan is:

"Hurrah for Moore—we want him to win!
We'll fight for our sisters, if we're not men."
The second slogan is even more euphonious running as follows:
"Moore, Moore was mayor before;
If we were men he'd be mayor again."

ATE MEAT 250,000 YEARS OLD???

NEW YORK, March 4.—A record feat in cold storage is recounted in a statement by Dr. Bayard S. Fuller, chief inspector of foods for New York city.

According to the doctor's story, there was discovered in Russia, some time ago the carcass of a mammoth which scientists said had been alive before the glacial period. That meant that the body, still in perfect condition, was more than 250,000 years old. Tests showed that the meat was well preserved, and a huge steak from it was served at a dinner given by a scientist. The guests pronounced the meat excellent. "Once meat or poultry has been frozen," says Dr. Fuller, "the passage of time has no effect on it, and fermentation is completely arrested, so long as it is kept in frozen condition. When thawing sets in, however, disintegration is rapid."
