

**POINDEXTER IS TALKED ALL OVER STATE**

**Spokane Man Who Is Touring the State Finds it Full of Insurgent Sentiment.**

"I have recently covered five Washington counties on a speaking tour, which has brought me into contact with all classes of citizens, and I have only found one man who was so bold as to venture the prediction that any other candidate than PoinDEXTER would win the senatorial fight," said R. B. Martin, president of the Spokane County Township and Good Government club, yesterday.

"I have met occasional voters who intend to support other candidates for one reason or another, but all of them I have talked to, with the one single exception, told me that PoinDEXTER is leading the race. It is the most one-sided fight I have ever known, so far as the sentiment among the farmers and in the small towns is concerned. Insurgent Sentiment Everywhere.

"The counties I have covered are those of Benton, Yakima, Klickitat, Clarke and Skamania. I have been traveling as a lecturer for the extension of the township government movement, and have lectured chiefly in the smaller towns. Every place I have visited I found a very vigorous insurgent sentiment. "I was particularly astonished at the PoinDEXTER sentiment in Yakima county. Senator Jones is popular there, but they are not going to follow his advice on the senatorship. On the contrary, the PoinDEXTER sentiment there is so overwhelming that one seldom hears mention of the name of any other candidate."
