### LET NEGROES VOTE

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., May 23.—The United States circuit court here today declared unconstitutional the "grandfather clause" amendment, which barred 40,000 negroes from participation in elections. It was a democratic measure.

### REGULARS FLEE

MEXICO CITY, May 22.—Fleeing before 11,000 rebels under Generals Figueroa and Ascencio, General Leyva and his 1,000 federals today have left Cuernavaca and its elaborate fortifications in charge of a single soldier, to turn them over to the insurgents.

### PRINT BILLION STAMPS.

LONDON, May 23.—With the coronation now one month distance, work commenced today on the new George V stamps. One million will be printed hourly from now on, requiring 2,000 reams of paper, one ton of gum arabic and 200 workmen. It is estimated that 1,000,000,000 stamps will be necessary.

### OPEN TO ALL

WASHINGTON, May 23.—If Germany is interested she may enter into the same arbitration proposition as has been submitted to Great Britain and France by the United States. Germany has been made aware of this and the state department expects a reply soon. It is stated that the arbitration proposition, in fact, is open to any and all nations.
