

### WEST CANADA GETS TOUCH OF REAL WINTER

WINNIPEG, Jan. 21.—Weather throughout the Canadian prairie west over the week-end has been the coldest experienced so far this winter, with the promise of continued very cold weather and slight higher temperatures today. Saskatchewan experienced the real cold, the mercury dipping to 49 below at Regina, while at Moose Jaw and Qu'Appelle it was 44 below and at Battleford 43 below. The freak of Western Canada was the severe weather which attacked British Columbia, it being 6 below zero at Kamloops and 4 below at Penticton, while at Grand Forks it was zero, and Nelson recorded 4 above.

### ASK STATE TO BACK CREDIT BANKS TO HELP SETTLERS IN DEVELOPING WASTE LANDS

Staff Special. OLYMPIA, Wash., Jan. 21.—Two separate bills, one by Representative T. K. Robe, of Snohomish, the other by Representative Pierce of Skagit, both progressives, dealing with the development of logged-off lands, will engage the attention of this legislature.

Both bills call for state aid to help settlers clear the waste lands. In each case the state's credit is to be used, the settlers repaying the state in small long-term installments. Robe's bill aims to aid those already on logged-off lands. Pierce's plans to open up new areas, have the state clear up to 10 acres or so, enough to enable each new settler to make a living while continuing the improvement work. Throughout the state, particularly in Western Washington, thousands of acres of logged-off lands lie waste and barren today which, with proper clearing and improvements, have potential fertility. The progressive party platform calls for state aid. Throughout the recent campaign, Ole Hanson of Seattle and other progressives, talked state-aid for the improvement of logged-off lands. The idea has now grown bigger than a mere party measure.

Robe would confine the state's supervision of the actual improvement work to state-owned lands, of which there are vast areas at the present time. Robe has had 20 years' experience with logged-off lands. "Getting the land is the easiest part," says Robe. "Logged-off lands now can be bought on a minimum small payment plan. The problem lies in carrying on the improvements. A plan for the state to clear 10 acres and place new settlers upon land is good enough, but in addition there must be devised a method to help that settler, and the settlers now on the land, to improve the rest of their land."

Robe's plan is for the organization of credit banks in each district where 10 or more owners of land desire it. These banks, consisting of these land owners, may appraise any applicant's land and issue an 80 per cent mortgage on it for a loan. The loan is not made directly by the bank, but is recommended by this credit bank to the state by issuing bonds for that purpose. The state auditor then sells the bonds in the same manner as other state bonds.

The state makes the first appraisal, the loan being based on the actual clear investment and value of improvements on the land. Thereafter the credit banks can issue bonds on the added improvements so the settler can continue on and on, paying but a small rate of interest, to make improvements. "That plan," says Robe, "which is a primary need for those already wrestling with logged-off lands, can be used as supplementary to the plan of the state clearing up small sections for new immigrants, to help the latter after their first hit, to continue the clearing of the rest of their tracts."

### EVANGELIST LAUDS CHIEF AND RAPS GRIFFITHS BILL

Before an audience of over 1,000 in the big Capitol Hill tabernacle Monday evening, Rev. W. B. Riley, the Minneapolis revivalist, urged that decency-loving people go out and work to defeat the Griffiths police bill. His subject was "The Sale of a Girl." He said girls would be sold again and again in Seattle if that bill were not repealed.

"The passage of that ordinance," said Dr. Riley, "would mean the flooding of your city with the worst crooks of the country, with the human vampires who prey on the innocence and purity of the land, with the sleuth hounds of hell."

"I have been told that the ordinance was passed because of police abuses and mistakes. I have also seen the figures of the work of the department of the police, against which the ordinance is aimed. I saw that 250 girls under the age of 18 had been taken from hotels and lodging houses during the term of your present chief of police."

"Of that number, two-thirds were found guilty of misconduct, the other third were apparently innocent. What if only one-third had been found guilty? Doesn't that make up for the other, even if we say that police made mistakes?"

"I have talked to the man I have talked to others about him, and I am convinced he is an honest, moral man. If I thought Minneapolis could get him, I would work night and day to bring it about. Seattle is fortunate in having Chief Bannick, and Seattle should get back of him and help."

### THIEVES TAKE GABY'S JEWELS, LEAVE COAT

NEW YORK, Jan. 21.—Claiming to have been robbed of \$70,000 worth of jewelry between here and Albany, Gaby Des Lys, the meteoric young actress, is today adding the police to recover the stolen gems. It was reported that most of the 10 trunks in which the effects of the actress and her company were being transported were rifled en route. Little besides jewelry was taken from Miss Des Lys' trunks, the robbers overlooking a \$5,000 chinchilla coat.

He is a graduate of Belvedere college, Dublin, and his father was former president of a bank in that place.

### WANTS BIG INDIAN TEEPEE FOR FAIR

OLYMPIA, Jan. 21.—To build an Indian tepee 150 feet high, 50 feet in diameter at the base, out of Washington timber at the Panama fair in 1915 is the suggestion by Senator Bethel of Lincoln county, who has presented a bill for the expenditure of \$130,000 on such a structure. His plan includes elevator service to a "lookout" on top.
