

"The first time HE forgets to be polite to HER and the first time SHE forgets to look her best in HIS eyes the glamor has commenced to wear, and there's the sign of trouble ahead."

Says System is Wrong

"A girl should be taught that her PRIMARY duty in life is to be able to give something to supply the great economic needs of the world."



GREAT TOWER OF BABEL REVEALED AFTER TWELVE YEARS OF DIGGING
