NEW YORK, June 9.—Miss Gladys Mason, vegetarian and pedestrian, is embarrassed. She asked for one man, and got 1,000. And still they're coming.

Miss Mason is the New York girl who announced recently that she was going to take a little stroll from her home, at 214 W. 85th st., to San Francisco. Also that she wanted to hire a guard and manager—an athletic young man who liked walking and didn't mind a jaunt like that. And she complained that she hadn't been able to find one.

It pays to advertise. As soon as Miss Mason's complaint broke into print, applications for the job began to pour in at the rate of 100 or more a day.

She says now she may leave New York earlier than she expected, just to avoid the rush. It's going to be a strictly vegetarian trip. Miss Mason won't eat meat or drink coffee or tea, and will do her daily 25 or 30 miles on two meals.

"People eat too much," she says. And her trip is largely in the nature of missionary work. She wants to show what can be done by a woman who doesn't use up all of her energy just digesting food. She eats fruits, vegetables and nuts, but doesn't believe in raw food except for people who live a very primitive life.

Miss Mason will be accompanied by a maid, as well as her manager. But she won't insist on the maid walking all the way.

SERVIAN AND BULGARIAN WAR DOGS STILL SNAPPING

LONDON, June 9.—More war in the Balkans was semi-officially admitted to be a serious possibility here today when the peace conference adjourned after a final session of three and a half hours. Servia did not participate.

The Balkan delegates will not meet again unless the Powers force a renewal of the negotiations. All the envoys agree that many important points growing out of the Turkish struggle remain unsettled, and while it is not admitted openly, there is now little doubt that the chances of Servia and Bulgaria resorting to the arbitration of war are more than grave.

TRICKED WIFE COMES TO PORTLAND TO GET EVEN

PORTLAND, June 9.—Miss Ethel Newcombe, who caused the arrest of E. von Klein in Chicago several months ago on a charge of having married her in San Francisco 18 months ago, afterward bringing her to Portland, where she alleges he took jewels valued at \$3,225 and then deserted her, is here today to prosecute the charges.

Miss Newcombe is emphatic in her declaration that von Klein is the man wanted, although he denies the identification. She declares they were married in San Francisco in September, 1911, by Rev. Dill.

Von Klein is in Portland, awaiting preliminary hearing, having been extradited after a prolonged legal battle.

NEW YORKERS INSULTING, SAYS SOCIETY ACTRESS

NEW YORK, June 9.—"No attractive woman can pass through any public place in New York without being insulted," Miss Evelyn Provost, a cousin of Mrs. John Jacob Astor, who started Brooklyn society a few months ago by her determination to leave society and earn her own living on the stage, made this statement today.

"A well-dressed woman who rides in a street car, although she may steadily look at the advertisements or down to the floor, is painfully conscious of the impudent and unflinching stare of most of the men within sight. I have acquired the habit of closing my eyes when in the subway at the risk of having people think that I suffer from the sleeping sickness. But you can't help hearing the indecent and daring remarks passed around you. The majority of men in public are not capable of judging the class of women they see. They have no respect for any woman whatsoever."

WOMAN, VICTIM OF ARMED MANIAC

KALAMAZOO, Mich. June 9.—Sheriff Chapman and posse are scouring the woods near here today for a maniac, armed to the teeth, who brutally assaulted Mrs. Cyrus Levy late Saturday night, after wounding her husband and attempting to kill four others. Mrs. Levy is in a critical condition.
