## STAR CORRESPONDENT TELLS WHY GEN. VILLA'S SUCCESSFUL

CHIHUAHUA, Mex., March 4.—During my association with rebel Gen. Villa, campaigning in Northern Mexico, I got to know that his great ambition is to be commander-in-chief of the Mexican army. He hopes to be the Napoleon who will root out the usurper Huerta, bring about peace and thus win himself the place at the head of the country's military establishment. It was in March, 1913, that he left El Paso with four loyal followers and his great army has grown from that little band of five, he has large cannon, small can-

non, machine guns and all kinds of rifles, and most of these have been captured from the federals. He told me he has been in 18 battles and has won 17 decisive victories, with one draw. Some record for one general. Most of the soldiers of the army Villa commands have the stamp of the Indian on their faces. They have been cowed for years never had a chance. But now that they have a dash- ing leader who has promised them that the land will be divided so that each man and his family will be given a chance to exist as a regular human being, they are in the fight with all their hearts. That is the reason of Gen. Villa's remarkable success.

SHREVEPORT, La., March 5.—With his pretty wife by his side, Hervey S. Little, real estate man of this city, deliberately shot down his old friend and business partner, J. J. Van Cleve, as they approached each other in the crowded lobby of a business block. That is the story which is being told to the jury in the sensational murder trial of Little and his wife, which is now being prosecuted. The prosecuting attorney will attempt to prove that Little shot Van Cleve in cold blood, at his wife's request. He asserts that Van Cleve had insulted Mrs. Little, and that she demanded that her husband deliberately sacrifice his old friend to her outraged honor.
