



# HOW WE WHIPPED MEXICO IN 1848! FULL STORY IN PICTURES!

Reproduction of a Series of Pictures Made 66 Years Ago During the Former War With Mexico, Showing the Most Exciting Episodes of That Conflict. The Originals of These Pictures Are Now in the War Department Museum in Washington and These Reproductions Were Made Especially for This Newspaper.



13,000 SOLDIERS LANDING AT VERA CRUZ

One of the important events in the war with Mexico was the landing of troops at Vera Cruz, which was looked upon as the "key to the country." Gen. Winfield Scott, who left New York, November 30, 1846, to take command of the American armies in Mexico, had charge of the expedition. He assigned 12,000 men and appointed the island of Lobos, about 125 miles north of Vera Cruz, as the place of rendezvous. He successfully landed near Vera Cruz March 9, 1847. Just opposite the city was an island fortress called the Castle of San Juan de Ulloa, which the Mexicans regarded as invulnerable. Gen. Scott commenced at once to completely invest both the fortress and the city of Vera Cruz with American forces. And the work was finished just four days after landing. His demand for a surrender led to the bombardment of Vera Cruz.

The bombardment of Vera Cruz lasted 15 days. It followed immediately after Gen. Winfield Scott summoned the city to surrender. The refusal of the demand was the signal for hostilities, and at once shells from seven mortars on land were hurled into the mass of humanity within the walls of the besieged city. The shells did terrible damage, and many women and children became victims. During the siege the Americans fired 3,000 ten-inch shells, 200 howitzer shells, 1,000 Paixham shot and 2,500 round shot, the whole weight of metal being about 500,000 pounds. On the morning of March 29, 1847, the commander of the post made overtures to surrender. On the 29th that took place. About 5,000 Mexicans marched out to a plain near the city and laid down their guns, gave up their flags and retired to the interior on parole.

## 5,500 BLUEJACKETS TO LAND

WASHINGTON, April 23.—By tonight 5,500 bluejackets and marines will be ashore at Vera Cruz, Secretary Daniels said today. There were 3,300 there today. The transport Mississippi, with 500 marines on board, was due to arrive late today. Daniels telegraphed to the Brooklyn navy yard to learn the earliest possible moment the battleships Navy and Texas, now repairing, can go into commission.

## PROVIDE \$142,000,000 FOR WAR

WASHINGTON, April 23.—The house naval committee planned to make the appropriation of \$142,000,000 in the annual naval bill available immediately. Republicans and democrats were agreed regarding this unusual step. Otherwise the money would not be available until June 1.
