### U. S. FLAG RAISED AT VERA CRUZ

VERA CRUZ, April 28.—The American flag was raised over the headquarters of Admiral Fletcher yesterday with the firing of a salute and a dress parade salute by marines. The banner has been flying over the custom house since the occupation of Vera Cruz by the Americans, but not until yesterday it was raised with formal ceremonies. That anti-Huerta sentiment is rapidly developing in Mexico City, is the statement of refugees arriving today. One demonstration so frightened the dictator he hid in a legation building, fearing assassination. Refugees say anti-American feeling is subsiding. Handbills are widely circulated in Mexico City, calling on citizens to protect foreigners, particularly Americans, and denouncing Huerta.

### MARGETT WOULD GO TO WAR

Capt. Edward John Margett, of the drill team, Foresters of America, a company of 40 trained men, does not put faith in talk of mediation in the Mexico fuss. He and his 40 men are ready to volunteer for service at any moment. He wishes to recruit his company to full war strength.

Capt. Margett's company took first prize as the best drilled at the Potlatch last summer. Margett is at present a member of the Seattle police force.

### BARNHISEL DIVORCE IS DENIED

TACOMA, April 28.—Decree of divorce was yesterday denied Rev. A. H. Barnhisel, former pastor of the First Presbyterian church of this city, by Judge John Mitchell, of Olympia, who heard the sensational case. Barnhisel charged that his wife gratified extravagant tastes, which, together with her social ambitions, plunged him into debt. Mrs. Barnhisel failed to file a counter-complaint while denying her husband's charges. Judge Mitchell held the debts to be honorable ones, and that Barnhisel should not be given relief from them, particularly when their children need the joint care and protection of both parents.

### PIRATES KILL 200 CHINESE

HONG KONG, April 28.—Two hundred Chinese were killed, according to messages received here today, in an attack by pirates on the British ship station near the neighboring island of Macao. Of those who perished, some were hacked to pieces by the pirates; others were forced to jump into the sea, and were drowned. Chief Officer Evans of the station, an Englishman, was also missing and probably dead. The other foreign officers and 150 Chinese escaped. The station was burned.

### REFUGEES' FATE STILL IN DOUBT

VERA CRUZ, April 28.—Definite information regarding the fate of the American refugees from Mexico City, forcibly removed from a train at Orizaba, is still lacking, although British Minister Sir Lionel Carden and Admiral Craddock, British naval commander, are exerting every effort to obtain information and afford protection. The British cruiser Hermione has taken 1,141 American refugees on board, and will sail for United States ports. Two hundred refugees, many of them ill clothed, are aboard an American-Hawaiian ship at Puerto.

### SEATTLE WOMEN TO CELEBRATE

All women who desire to sign the resolution addressed to congress calling for nation-wide women's suffrage, are invited to join with the members of the Seattle Suffrage club at 1 o'clock next Saturday at the Allen Dale cafeteria. The women will observe Women's Independence day on Saturday, and there will be present representatives from every woman's organization in the city, many of whom will take an active part in the program at the luncheon.

### THEY FIGHT ADDITIONAL EXPENSE

Opposition to the additional expense of \$40,000 to complete the municipal tubercular sanatorium at Firlands is lining up in the city council. The appropriation of \$212,000 was considered enough to cover the work. Resolutions have been introduced in council to authorize the board of public works to finish the job.

### ARRESTED FOR LOSS OF \$14,000

Police last night arrested William S. Ferguson, 45, on a charge said to involve him in the loss of \$14,000 by the National Bank of Commerce and the National Drugist, a periodical, of St. Louis.

He has been working here in the office of a ship construction company.


