PARK "SPOONING" AIDED BY CITY

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., May 22.—For the first time since Birmingham became a city the taboo against "spooning" in the public parks has been lifted, whether it be done in the dark or under electric lights. Sweethearts who heretofore have been denied the use of the public parks for billing and cooing will not only be permitted the use of the benches in the parks, but they will be actually encouraged in their love-making by the city commission, which has given directions to this effect to the police department.
