2 ARE KILLED ON DIAMOND; HIT ON HEAD

Baseball resulted fatally for two players yesterday afternoon. The tragedies occurred in Tompkinsville, Ky., and Rockville, Conn.

Bill Hammer, age 21, a teacher in one of the Tompkinsville public schools, got out with some of his pupils for a game of scrub during the recess period. While batting, a wild throw from the pitcher caught him on the side of the head. The blow caused a rupture of a blood vessel of the brain. He died shortly afterward.

The second victim of the national pastime was Frank Boucher, 22, killed at Rockville. A pitched ball struck him on the forehead. He fell unconscious and died two hours later.
