When the official batting averages for the Northwestern players are computed, the figures probably will show, Charley Swain in third place.



REMARKABLE GAME PLAYED AT DUGDALE'S

The Northwestern league season came to a fitting close in Seattle Sunday afternoon when the Ballard and Tacoma teams played off the first game of their double-header in exactly 47 minutes—the league record.

The world's record for fast games in 31 minutes, but yesterday's mark has been equaled but few times in the history of the national pastime.

BIG SHAKEUP THREATENED IN NATIONAL

CHICAGO, Sept. 14.—Rumor that Charles P. Taft will be eliminated from baseball both in Chicago and Cincinnati; the retirement of Charles Ebbett from the National league; the elimination of the Cincinnati crowd from the National game, is prevalent today.

It is proposed that the Wards of Brooklyn take over Ebbett's interests and that Charles Weegman and his financial allies buy the Taft interests; that men now in the Federal league replace the discordant elements in the National; that the Federal league ceases to exist and that the National continue—with the strongest of the Fed leaguers taken into fold.
