ENGLISH CHANGE CONTINENTAL BASE TO DUNKIRK

LONDON, Oct. 15.—A number of warships and transports were reported off Dunkirk, France, today. It was learned that the British had transferred their continental base to this point. It was previously at Ostend.

The latter was no longer tenable, owing to the proximity of the Germans. The official war information bureau, however, had no fresh news concerning the Belgian situation.

Vessels thought to be transports were also said to have been sighted near the Portuguese coast. British transports are known to have been in Portuguese waters for several days. The admiralty was reticent regarding the report.

VENUS LOCKED IN STEEL SAFE
PARIS, Oct. 15.—For the past month the staff of the Louvre has been working hard to protect the chief works of art from what a French newspaper says is the only danger that menaces them—bombs from the air.

In 1879 the Venus of Milo was walled up in a subterranean niche. She is now enclosed in a steel room. The Winged Victory is behind heavy iron plates, and La Gioconda, smiles inscrutably in obscurity.

The Grecian hall, which contains the masterpieces of Phidias, is protected by sacks filled with earth. The upper stories of the Louvre, with their glass roofs, have been turned into hospitals under the flag of the Red Cross.
