3,000 SEATTLE BABES TO ENTER IN BIG CONTEST

How's the baby? Three thousand of Seattle's prettiest, most healthy children will compete for honors as better babies at contests to be held in twelve school districts here in as many consecutive days, beginning April 29.

These competitions are to be part of a nation-wide contest to determine the best babies in America. Similar contests will be held in every city in the United States.

Under the auspices of joint committees from the Parent-Teachers association and the Mothers' congress, local contests will be held for the babies of each school district. Georgetown children will compete first in a contest to be held April 29, when competent physicians will act as judges.

Children between the ages of six months and six years will be eligible.

City Will Co-operate

At a meeting of the better babies committee of the Parent-Teachers association and Mothers' congress held Wednesday afternoon, Dr. W. C. Lippincott assured the cooperation of the child welfare division of the city health department in providing necessary equipment for handling of infants at all contests.

Dr. Lippincott's suggestion that children's specialists be asked to give 20-minute lectures to mothers during these contests on matters concerning care of children was adopted.

"Thus far, development towards better babies has been negative," he said. "That is, we have always told the child, 'Do not do this' or 'Do not do that.' What we must tell him is what to do. That's what he wants to know now, and the best way for mothers to learn how to advise their children is through some specialist whose authority can not be questioned."

"A great deal could be accomplished by instructing the mother in the care of children before they become of school age, or even in the pre-natal stage.

"Birth certificates, if followed up, should open a good field for better babies' work.

"The health department has a moving picture machine which it will be glad to loan for the purpose of illustrating lectures during the better babies contests."

It was estimated by Mrs. Fred Bert, chairman of the committee, that each district should provide 50 babies for contest. No prizes will be given, the contests to be held solely for the purpose of aiding mothers towards better care of their offspring, and to determine which children may compete in the national contest later on.

NEW YORK, April 8.—The "Hotel de Gink" has housed its last guest. It was closed today. Jeff Davis, manager, and the man who inaugurated the plan, said the "charity trust" had put him out of business, but that he would reopen a similar place somewhere else next winter.

Drys Plan to Get Control of National Democracy

Prohibition advocates today claimed that President Wilson will be compelled to take a positive stand as soon as congress reconvenes if he is not "smoked out" sooner.

In a letter to L. W. Keeney of the Iowa state democratic committee, Secretary Bryan declared that whoever succeeds Judge Wade as national committee member should be a prohibitionist.

"Well, maybe you could do it." "Never mind now! This is the last time I want to talk to you about keeping the corridor quiet. Bring them in here."



A.—Half a tablespoon sal, 1 teaspoon mustard, 1 1/2 tablespoons sugar, few grains cayenne, 1 tablespoon flour, yolks 2 eggs; 1: fat; 2: spoons melted butter, 3/4 cup milk, 1/2 cup vinegar.

Mix dry ingredients and yolks of eggs, slightly beaten, butter, milk and vinegar very slowly. Cook over boiling water until mixture thickens; strain and cool.

TODD HOPES FOR FAVORABLE RULING IN JITNEY BUS CASE

Optimistic that the supreme court will declare invalid the emergency clause in the jitney bus bill, Attorney Hugh C. Todd, who made the argument for the bus men Wednesday, is back in the city.

One of the points urged by Todd was that the legislature itself betrayed the fact that no real emergency existed for the measure, since it fixed April 10 as the date of its going into effect, instead of making it effective immediately.

"This argument favorably impressed the judges," said Todd, "and they asked Attorney General Tanner about it."

"Tanner replied the legislature wanted to give the jitney men a chance to meet the law but that the emergency existed."
