## CLANCY BEER CHANGES; IT'S FUNNY STUFF

Chemist Examines It and Finds Alcohol; Examines It Again and Finds No Alcohol.

### PROSECUTOR ANGRY

Intimates Somebody Switched the Evidence on Him; Girls Testify in Trial.

Congratulate John Clancy. He has it coming.

The mystery of the Pacific Social club is an unsolved puzzle, and the stuff that Clancy is said to have sold at the roadhouse on the Meadows—the stuff that looked like beer, tasted like beer and was contained in Rainier beer bottles, is—well, what is it?

Prosecuting Attorney Lundin swears the stuff WAS beer, but isn't so sure that it IS beer.

In short, he believes somebody switched the bottles, or the contents of the bottles, that were confiscated in the St. Patrick's night raid by deputy sheriffs.

Here's his proof:

Tested Like Real Beer

The stuff was sent to the university, and chemical test showed it contained 5 per cent alcohol, which is all that perfectly good beer is supposed to show.

Rainier brewers say they never bottle beer that contains less than 3 per cent alcohol.

But when the stuff was sent again to the chemist yesterday, because George Vanderveer, Clancy's attorney, insisted on another analysis, it analyzed LESS THAN ONE PER CENT ALCOHOL.

And the other booze taken in the raid, witnesses testified, did not belong to Clancy or the Pacific Social club or the Meadows roadhouse or to D. P. McRae, but was part of the private stock of E. F. Purcell, who formerly occupied the Clancy place as a private residence before he sold it to Clancy last May.

Purcell says 'Twas His

Purcell swore he ordered the stuff, along with a lot of household furniture, stored in the barn when he left the house. He was going East, he said, at the time, and couldn't wait to move all his goods.

Col. C. D. Dalton, Purcell's attorney, testified he had personally overseen the placing of Purcell's stock of liquors in the barn.

And it was in the barn that the deputies found the booze with which they sought to convict Clancy.

Altho Deputies Campbell and Malone, who made the raid, told the jury that 50 people were at the roadhouse that night, dancing, drinking and singing boisterous songs, Miss Olive Flick and Miss Helen Fox, who were arrested in the raid, testified they saw only three or four other couples there that evening.

Say No Beer Allowed

Campbell and Malone testified that people in the house rushed to the windows with bottles, which they threw out when they saw the officers coming.

The two girls denied that any bottles had been in the house that night, with the exception of four they had brought there themselves.

"And they scolded us for bringing them," they declared. "The waiters told us it was against the rules of the house. We only had four bottles of beer, and we thought we could drink them in there."

Clancy did not take the stand. Neither did D. P. McRae, the president of the Pacific Social club, who like Clancy, was charged with having liquor in his possession, with intent to sell it in a "dry" unit.

Lundin Still Fighting

The only scrap of evidence left in favor of the state is the government revenue license, granting the holder the right to sell liquor under the name of the Pacific club, at the Meadows. Prosecutor Lundin is fighting hard to get a conviction on this.

But most he is concerned with the mystery—WHO SWITCHED THE BEER?

The case was before a jury in Judge Grady's court. Judge Grady is sitting here from North Yakima. Arguments were heard Friday.

## DON'T MONKEY WITH TARIFF, WARNS HILL

NEW YORK, April 23.—An address full of political warning by James J. Hill, captain of industry and founder of the Great Northern, was read at the banquet of the American News paper Publishers last night.

Hill said, in part, that "no one, accustomed to reading the signs of the times can fail to see that a determined effort will be made to give the tariff the leading place in the next national campaign.

"An effort will be made to secure a general revision upward by a number of political leaders who adhere to the belief that there is one more president in the tariff."

"That the country can live and thrive under the existing tariff is clear to all.

"Under the stimulus of many years of tariff subsidy the manufacturing interests of this country have been built up to a point where the home demand cannot absorb more than two-thirds the product. Whether this is a good or bad thing does not matter now. It is a fact, and what is to be done with the extra one-third?

"Either we must curtail production one-third or find customers for the surplus one-third. The first course will have few advocates and if we are to sell the extra one-third it can only be done by enlarging the market thru reduced prices. It would be folly to stimulate (with increased tariff) an increase of surplus production.

"The reason for expressing these views here is that, if the newspapers of the country could make it plain that they will disapprove such a movement, which can only have a political motive and only injurious industrial consequences, the attempt will not be made."

## IMPRESARIO DE AD; HIS WIFE TRIES TO FOLLOW HIM TO GRAVE

PORTLAND, April 23.—The life of pretty Signorina Ida Bonora, for 12 years recognized as the wife of Mario Lambardi, the grand opera impresario, who died of apoplexy Thursday, was hanging by a slender thread today as the result of taking bichloride of mercury while grieving over the passing of the man for whom her love and admiration is said to have been intense.

Heartbroken, Signorina Bonora took the deadly poison last night, after being hysterical for many hours.

She was found writhing in agony on the floor of her apartments by a messenger boy who was responding to a call. A picture of the dead impresario was clasped to her heart.

Physicians at the Good Samaritan hospital say that life is ebbing fast away.

Signorina Bonora became acquainted with the impresario at Milan, Italy, in 1902, when, struck by her grace and beauty, he engaged her as a ballet dancer in one of his productions. She is 32 years old.
