MAYOR GILL CITED BY COURT ON ADMIRAL WAY BOND DISPUTE

Superior Judge Albertson issued a writ of mandate Thursday, commanding Mayor Gill to approve the contractor's bond for the improvement of Admiral way, in West Seattle, or show cause why he should not do so in open court Monday.

The writ issued upon the affidavit of Fred T. Sherman, president and manager of the Independent Asphalt Co., which holds the contract for Admiral way improvement.

The bond has already been approved by Assistant Corporation Counsel Pierce, and Sherman holds that it is the mayor's duty to approve it at once that work may be commenced.

Explaining his attitude, Mayor Gill said this morning: "In the first place, I vetoed the bill because I did not believe the people who must pay for the improvement wanted it. It was passed over my veto and the final vote was not unanimous. In the second place, I believe the law requires a unanimous vote."

"Another point was that when Avalon way was completed the city signed an agreement that Admiral way was not to be attempted until the Avalon way financial matters were settled. This has not yet been done."

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EX-SENATOR BAILEY GETS CALLED DOWN
WASHINGTON, May 20.—Justice McCoy of the district supreme court today severely rebuked Joseph Bailey, former United States senator from Texas, during his argument as counsel for the Riggs National bank in its suit against Secretary McAdoo and Comptroller John Skelton Williams on charges of conspiracy.

Bailey made a remark which the court thought discourteous and he told the former senator so in no uncertain language.

FRAUD CHARGED IN WOMEN'S MEETING
SAN FRANCISCO, May 20.—Politics and charges of fraud today invaded the convention of the California Federation of Women's clubs. Alleging the faction which presented the ticket nominating Mrs. Emily Hoppin of Yolo county for the presidency, fraudulently placed two names on the petition, followers of Mrs. A. F. Jones of Oroville are making a fight against her election.

KELLOGG GUILTY
William H. Kellogg, a young civil engineer, was found guilty Friday of the seduction of Grace McIntosh, a Vashon Island young woman. This was Kellogg's second trial, the jury having disagreed before. Testimony showed Kellogg and the girl had at one time tried to lay blame upon a Spokane traveling salesman to delude Miss McIntosh's parents. Kellogg is seeking a \$2,000 bond preparatory to an appeal.

Peck, who operates a bus to the Duwamish valley. He is charged with failure to obtain the \$2,500 bonds. The arrest was made by Constable Shannon. There were twelve passengers in his car when he was taken to police station.

REPORT TRENCHES JUST SEA OF MUD
PARIS, May 20.—Heavy rains in Northern France and Flanders have rendered the trenches as a sea of mud. Military operations are impossible. The official communique today merely stated there was "nothing new to report."


