

Barney Oldfield, in trial run, makes 99 1/2 miles an hour at Tacoma speedway. Summer bargain, no doubt. Reduced from 100.


Weather will be fine on the Fourth, is report of bureau at Washington, D. C. Thanks for the lobster.
