PRAISES FOR UNITED PRESS

SAN FRANCISCO, July 8.—Declaring the United Press played a big part in making the new order of things in journalism possible, J. A. Schermerhorn, publisher of the Detroit Times, spoke for that organization at today's session of the International Press Congress.

He declared that, under the old system of restriction and limitation, it was impossible for a newspaper to adopt an aggressive policy such as marks the newspaper of today. He paid tribute to the achievements of the United Press staff men in the European war, declaring the organization had come with flying colors thru the greatest test to which journalism had ever been put.

Returning to their country, not to fight, but to take the places of those who have been killed fighting, and to become the bread-winners for the women and children of their land, 147 Montenegrins from the Arizona coal fields passed thru Seattle Wednesday night.

Hordon Jacavich, leader of the party, says the response to the call for volunteers in Arizona was surprising.

"There are but few Montenegrins there now, whereas a few weeks ago the mining districts were practically all populated by our countrymen," he said.

INDICT FIVE AT CHICAGO

CHICAGO, July 8.—Five representatives of Montenegro in the United States were indicted by the federal grand jury here today on a charge of violating neutrality by seeking to enlist persons within the United States. The men are Javo Macanovich, formerly Montenegrin charge d'affaires at Constantinople; P. M. Lubich, assistant to Matanovich, arrested at Portland; B. Martinovich and Savo Glourashkovich, members of the Montenegrin Red Cross commission, arrested in Bisbee, Ariz., and Anto V. Zetrovitch, arrested in New York.


