

## Cynthia Grey's LETTERS

Q.—What will take a peach stain from a white skirt? GEORGIA.

A.—Cover it with a paste of salt and lemon juice; or dip in a weak solution of chloride of lime, spread in the sun to bleach, then wash thoroughly.

Q.—Please tell me how to can vegetable soup. ECONOMY.

A.—The following recipe provides a mixture which may be turned into soup or a roast, as desired. Add water or meat stock for a soup when the can is opened, or add bread crumbs for a baked dish.

Prepare corn, lima beans, tomatoes, string beans, okra, squash and egg plant, as you would for canning separately. Mix these in varying proportions, letting the corn and lima beans predominate. Add two or three medium-sized onions to each quart of this mixture and run all thru a food chopper, in order to mix it thoroughly. Pack into jars and sterilize.

In preparing for the table, mix with an equal volume of bread crumbs, a piece of butter the size of a walnut and one egg; season to taste with pepper and salt, and bake in a round baking dish until brown. Cut into slices as you would a cake and serve hot, with a drawn butter sauce.

Corn, okra and tomatoes, mixed in equal proportions, may be canned in this way as a soup stock.





## RUSSIANS NOW CLAIM CHECK ON TEUTON ADVANCE

PETROGRAD, Sept. 15.—German plans to capture Dvinsk, key to the path to Petrograd, have been seriously checked.

German cavalry, which reached the Vlna-Petrograd railway, has been repulsed, and Russian forces have recaptured the railway from Dvinsk to Vlna.

The official statement issued last night claimed capture of an Austrian battalion near Zwedzie, 1,200 prisoners near Gueszwa and 1,400 in villages southwest of Wisniewac.

The struggle in Galicia continues, with the Russians still on the offensive.

## W.G.T.U. CONVENTION TRIES TO ESCAPE; W.G.T.U. CONVENTIN STARTS BIG FIRE

BELLINGHAM, Sept. 15.—It is estimated today that a total damage of \$1,000 is the result of fire in the courthouse yesterday, caused by the overturning of a candle being used by W. B. Graff, a county prisoner, to light the work of digging his way thru the jail ceiling in an attempt to escape. The flame ignited papers in the treasurer's office.

## ABERDEEN PUTS LID ON SPOONING

ABERDEEN, Sept. 15.—Lovers who have been using the magazine reading room in the city hall as a rendezvous will have to seek elsewhere for a quiet place to spoon. On complaint of the Aberdeen Civic Improvement association, which maintains the room, the police have been instructed to clamp the lid on spooning there.

OLYMPIA, Sept. 15.—Joe Parrot, convicted of murder in the first degree for killing Fred Weis, Olympia tailor, has been denied a new trial by Judge D. F. Wright, who refused to consider affidavits tending to show Parrot was in Snohomish the night of the murder. He says it contradicts Parrot's own testimony.
