**Seattle Woman Reveals Hidden Chapter in Snobish Politics**

Living with her grandmother, Mrs. Eleanor Ferguson, in the Beaumont apartments, 1512 Summit ave., is a little girl of 8 who plays the piano wonderfully.

Her name is Dora Anna Vivian Ferguson. Her grandmother took her from her mother's arms the day the mother died, unable to endure the suffering of bringing her babe into the world.

This and what follows, is revealed in a suit filed here Wednesday. Mrs. Ferguson adopted the little girl, and they lived for a time with Fred E. Ferguson, the grandfather, on a farm near Monroe.

Ferguson had been in the saloon business, but he promised to quit when he married, and did. But a year of farm life palled on him and he spent much of his time in Monroe, drinking.

He became such a boon and hearty fellow that he was urged to run for the commission of Snohomish county.

Meanwhile, Mrs. Ferguson threatened divorce. He offered her \$10,000 cash to keep the scandal quiet until after his political campaign, she says.

She got the divorce, and with it all money for the keep and education of their granddaughter.

Ferguson has gone back into the saloon business at Monroe, and is earning in the neighborhood of \$50 a day. The little girl is progressing rapidly in school, having reached the fifth grade, but her most wonderful accomplishment is her mastery of the piano.

Ferguson is now being sued by his former wife for alimony he is alleged not to have paid, but the little girl may go on with her musical education.

Then the curtain rose. The effect was almost magical. The men in the audience might have been wearing evening clothes. The women might have been beautifully, fashionably gowned. The theatre might have been anywhere.

The audience forgot the crashing looms in the jute mill, the silence of the cells, the rigorous discipline, sometimes cruel, discipline. The performers forgot they were in a prison and that the audience "out in front" was not a "paying crowd."

"The play's the thing!" The audience—the easiest-to-laugh audience—anticipated the laughable situations while the actors were working them up, and laughed ahead of time.

The performers responded, and laughed, too. Never were audience and performers more in rapport. The forger's aesthetic features were humanized by humor, and he grinned genially. The yegg seemed less bestial as he laughed and slapped his knee and jabbed an elbow into the forger's ribs. The dip was not the furtive little animal he had been. He was a staunch patron of the drama before he began his term.

The lifer forgot for an hour or so that he must stay in prison until he dies. He threw back his head and roared with mirth, like any other good fellow whose sense of humor has been tickled.
