BILL SHEPHERD IN SERBIA; SEES DOOMED NATION

SALONIKA, Nov. 18.—Thousands of Serbs in the Monastir region are fleeing before the Bulgarians. Monastir is being rapidly emptied of its population. Throughout the region, the people are terrorized by stories of Bulgarian atrocities.

The prefect of Prilep telegraphed that the Bulgarians have taken refuge there, after being mistreated, and that the town is now about to fall into the Bulgarians' hands.

Monastir can hold out for a day. Then she will be doomed unless the allies arrive.

I have just come from there, after witnessing most pathetic sights among terrified men, women and children. They were trying frantically to leave the city.

Household effects were packed hurriedly, in the hope of saving something from the ruins. Some of the inhabitants piled their little properties on wagons. Many bent under their loads.

Some of them took with them their household pets—cats and dogs—so that in the days of wandering about, they would have one or two friends in the world.

Most of the fugitives were feeble old men and women, and little children, for all the women of fighting age are afield with the men and all boys old enough to lift a gun.

Monastir, once the Bulgarians with funds are due on a special train here today.

RUSH REINFORCEMENTS

GILL CRITICAL BUT SAYS HE'LL SIGN DRY BILL

Mayor Gill Thursday answered

his statement of Councilman Hesketh in yesterday's Star that Hesketh's dry ordinance was too "tight" to suit Gill.

He repeated the ordinance was defective and would permit illicit liquor selling.

Referring to Hesketh's statement that the mayor had been "hollering" for a year for a dry ordinance, Gill said he had asked the council to pass such an ordinance many months before the dry law would become effective, so he would have ample time to sign or veto it after it was passed.

"But the council has waited until the last moment, and now I shall have to sign it. There isn't time to veto it," said the mayor. "I'll sign it despite the fact that it is ineffective and invalid."

DUWAMISH FOLK GIVEN REDUCED CARLINE RATES

Reduced passenger rates to

Pointa on the Puget Sound interurban, between Renton and Renton, will become effective November 25. Thanksgiving day, the reduction being based on a schedule of approximately 2 cents a mile.

According to Manager Louis Bean, of the Puget Sound Electric railway, the present commutation schedule will be lowered considerably when the new rates are put in force, and the issuance of commutation tickets will cease. The new rates include all transfer privileges.

The fare to Renton will be reduced from 54 to 25 cents, round trip, and other points will be reached at correspondingly smaller fares.

U. P. REPORT SENT TO ALASKA BY MARCONI

Communication between the Seattle bureau of the United Press and Seattle, Alaska, 1,500 miles away, was interrupted Wednesday by a break in the government cable. The press matter then was filed over the Marconi system, of which Irwin is Northwest manager.

nicked parts glistened. So did the pots and pans. It was a beautiful kitchen.

A kettle was steaming on the stove. There would be a comforting cup of tea presently. Meanwhile the widow wept and would not be comforted, and the other women wept with her.

A miner, aged and bent, and gnarled by labor, entered, and awkwardly sought to speak words of comfort.

"Tis a terrible thing, Mrs. Davis," he said. "But think of all the poor chaps that's being killed in Europe!"

The words were kindly meant, but the widow found scant comfort in them.

Thirty odd friends and neighbors died in the mine, and Ravensdale mourns.

A million men lie stark on the battlefield, and the story of their end is not worth the front page.

"He was a good man," wept the little widow. "A better never lived. Every thought was for my comfort."

She wept afresh. Her partner of 40 years was dead. They had left Wales together when the oldest child was a baby. They had had eight children and buried four.

Her husband had been in five explosions. She had feared him dead at each first alarm. Each time

SURVIVING MINERS OUT OF WORK; REPAIR ROAD TO THE CEMETERY

RAVENSDALE, Wash., Nov. 18.—A rough and rocky road leads from the little town of Ravensdale to a little cemetery

on the hill, half a mile away. At this time of year it is almost impassable. Today a big gang of mine workers are repairing it. They are toiling silently and gloomily.

Two days ago they were working at the Northwestern Improvement company's coal mine here, or in other mines nearby. But when the explosion came Tuesday afternoon, wrecking the mine, and burying more than 30 men, the Ravensdale miners were thrown out of work, and the others, as is the custom of miners, quit their jobs and journeyed to the scene of the tragedy.

Part of them donned helmets and tried to rescue the entrapped miners, 1,200 feet down in the earth.

The others, having nothing to do, went to work on the road to the cemetery.

The road will experience unusually heavy travel the next few days.

The roads leading from Black Diamond, Carbonado and other mine districts hereabouts were lined all day yesterday with miners walking to Ravensdale. They congregated here about the mouth of the slope and discussed the disaster.

With 22 miners still buried on the third level of the mine, and with nine bodies recovered, it is believed today, after a careful checking up, that the total dead will be 21.

All hope of finding life in any of the 22 still underground has been abandoned.

It may be a week before the debris still wedged into the level, between the rescuers and the bodies, can be cleared away.
