TARRYTOWN, N. Y., Nov. 22.—Tarrytown today is an armed camp as a result of the discovery of a cleverly planned bomb plot to end the life of President John D. Archbold, of the Standard Oil company. Around the Archbold estate, particularly, extra lines of guards have been thrown.

SUSPECTS GRAFT IN NEW NAVY LEAGUE

NEW YORK, Nov. 22.—Investigation of the Navy league will be sought in a resolution Congressman Tavenner announced today he intends to introduce into congress. “I will introduce a resolution to investigate the league,” he said, “specifically requiring Morgan and other directors, past and present, to testify whether they own stock in war trafficking concerns that have drawn fat army and navy contracts.”

OREGON HIT BY SEVERE WIND STORM

PORTLAND, Nov. 22.—Damage done by the southwest gale Sunday was being repaired today. The right field fence at the Coast League park was blown down, and several small buildings around town demolished.

SCHOONER RUNS ASHORE IN THICK FOG

SAN DIEGO, Nov. 22.—The lumber schooner Noyo, Capt. Olsen, bound from Port Bragg to San Diego, with a load of ties, is ashore off LaJolla, 14 miles north of here, today.

UTAH ACTS AGAINST I. W. W. THREATS

SALT LAKE CITY, Nov. 22.—I. W. W. threats that Utah “will soon have cause to remember the day they took Joe Hillstrom out and shot him,” voiced at Hillstrom's funeral, caused officials today to redouble efforts to rid the state of agitators. Hillstrom's body is en route to Chicago, where “Big Bill” Haywood, I. W. W. leader, promises the biggest funeral in Chicago's history. Six Swedish girls acted as Hillstrom's pallbearers in the simple service here, without priest or prayer, yesterday.

RADIUM IS ALMOST CHEAP NOW—REALLY

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22.—Cancer sufferers heard joyfully today the interior department announcement that the government has succeeded in supplying two hospitals with radium for treating the great red plague at \$37,000 a gram, against private prices heretofore as high as \$160,000. Even further reductions may be expected.

TRACTION FRANCHISE MATTER UP

The franchise committee of the council will consider, Friday, the terms upon which the traction company offers to enter into a new franchise agreement with the city for steam service to business houses. The franchise expired last February, and has not been renewed. The city offered to renew if the traction company would carry passengers from Division A to the Lake Burien division of the municipal lines on a transfer basis, for 1 cent a passenger. The company refused to consider this offer.

CARRANZA PLANS DECISIVE ATTACK

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22.—Carranzista forces are mobilizing in Northern Mexico for a pretentious campaign to crush Villa. The state department has given Gen. Obregon, Carranzista commander, permission to move 2,000 more of his troops from Piedras Negras to Douglas.

VILLA'S TROOPS IN SAD PLIGHT

DOUGLAS, Ariz., Nov. 22.—Somewhere between Hermosillo and Nogales the Villista army is reported making a march northward, with scanty provisions and little water for the suffering troops.

WILL MEET TEXAS GOVERNOR

LAREDO, Nov. 22.—Chief Executive Carranza of Mexico will meet Gov. Ferguson of Texas tomorrow at the bridge here, to discuss recent border raids and to seek a means of co-operation between Texas and Mexican authorities to end them.

PRESIDENT WILL SEE FOOTBALL GAME

NEW YORK, Nov. 22.—President Wilson will see the Army and Navy football game here on Thanksgiving day.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22.—The interstate commerce commission today held reasonable the \$1.50 rate on plate glass from James City, Pa., to Seattle.

NEW YORK, Nov. 22.—How President Roosevelt in 1907 counseled the then President Mellen of the New Haven to acquire the Boston & Maine railroad was recounted today by Mellen on the stand in the government's conspiracy case, involving the directors of the road.

WIFE OF PUBLISHER KILLED BY AUTO

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 22.—Mrs. Henry J. Pauley, wife of the Los Angeles publisher, was killed today and Pauley was seriously injured when their automobile turned over on a steep grade in Pacoima canyon, near San Fernando.

FIRE THREATENS MILITARY HOSPITAL

PARIS, Nov. 22.—Fire in a military hospital in the annex to the city's largest department store nearly trapped 90 wounded soldiers today. Firemen and spectators made many heroic rescues, finally carrying all to safety.


