Brodtkorb, to Acapulco, Mexico, was announced here Tuesday, following two unsuccessful attempts of the craft to get to sea from Neah bay. Her seams have opened and the engineer is unable to make steam sufficient for the voyage with the coal in her bunkers.

FIND HACK SAWS IN CELL Nine steel hack saws are said to have been found in the cell of Jack O'Hair, county jail prisoner, who is facing, Tuesday, a charge of grand larceny. If convicted, he may be tried as an habitual criminal. It is said, the penalty for which is life imprisonment. He is 24. Jailer Hailley found the saws, a razor and knife in the young man's cell Monday.

POLICE SEEK "POISON-PEN WRITER" NEW YORK, Nov. 30.—Police today sought a woman "poison-pen writer," believed to be a paranoiac, who has written, recently, letters to 23 brides, charging their husbands with immorality.

All the brides addressed were women whose weddings the papers had described at length. The letters were in the same handwriting, and each started, "I write you at random. I am an utter stranger to you," after which came the charges against the husbands. Postmarks indicate that the author is an inmate of a Pennsylvania insane asylum.

JAPAN SUSPENDS STOCK EXCHANGE TOKIO, Nov. 30.—The wildest skyrocketing of war stocks in the history of Japan today forced temporary suspension of the stock exchange. In a frantic bull market, some of the leading issues rose \$500 during the early hours of the session. The boom resulted from heavy munitions sales to Russia, which is floating a heavy credit here to insure prompt payments.

14 PER CENT SAILORS REJECTED PORTLAND, Nov. 30.—About 14 per cent of the sailors examined under the new seaman's law in the Portland, Puget sound and San Francisco districts have been rejected, John K. Bulgar, supervising inspector of the Pacific district, stated today.

About 2,700 sailors have been examined on the Coast thus far.

NO COMBINE FOR BULL MOOSERS NEW YORK, Nov. 30.—"No combine with the G. O. P." stands today as the bull moose slogan. This decision against amalgamation has been reached by the national executive committee. Nothing but a straight ticket for 1916 will do, leaders declared. Moreover, they hinted that Roosevelt might be induced to lead the hosts, with, possibly, Johnson of California as a running mate. The national committee will meet, January 16, in Chicago, to fix the convention date and place.
