### LUNDIN TO TEST THE NEW DRINK

Prosecutor May Deal Death Blow to Much-Mooted Lifestaff

### COURT WILL DECIDE

"Lifestaff," the new "dry" beverage, is to have its day in court. Prosecutor Lundin said Tuesday he would probably bring a test case against the Hemrich Brewing Co. of Seattle in a few days to determine whether "Lifestaff" and other drinks of the same class must be banished with the high-power goods. A mooted point has arisen. The law forbids the sale of "malt or other liquors containing intoxicating qualities."

Three Results The first test showed 5 per cent alcohol, the second 6 per cent, while the third revealed not so much as a trace of anything intoxicating.

The presence of alcohol in the first two samples taken from the spigot at the brewery was explained to Lundin by Louis Hemrich, who said the first samples had been drawn shortly after the pipes had been emptied of beer.

Probably, he thought, some of the alcohol had remained in the pipes and came out with the "Lifestaff."

No denial is made, however, of the fact that "Lifestaff" is a "malt" liquor, and should the courts hold that the new "dry" law banishes all malt liquor, "Lifestaff" must go.

All Malt Barred? The question in the prosecutor's mind is whether the law as intended to forbid the sale of intoxicating malt liquor only, or every form of malt liquor, whether intoxicating or not.

The test case will determine this point finally for all time.

Lundin issued a warning to all periodical and news dealers Tuesday that all magazines and other literature sold by them must positively contain no advertisement pertaining to liquor or liquor manufacturers.

"They must clip all such advertising out of the pages of newspapers and periodicals before they sell them," he stated. "Otherwise they will be prosecuted."

### GAVE HUSBAND HIS START, WIFE SAYS

Mrs. Julia Snedeker, wife of Fred Snedeker, a wealthy fisherman, started suit for divorce Tuesday, alleging she had "staked" her husband a fortune, and that he had lately fallen in love with another woman.

Snedeker is owner of the halibut fishing boats Pacific and Shan-rock, valued at several thousand dollars, and has ten acres of land near the east end of Lake Washington, said to be worth \$12,000. His income, says his wife, is \$1,000 a month.

### HAVE YOU SEEN RICHARD BARIL?

Who knows Richard Baril? Mrs. Annie Baril, his mother, of Gently, Quebec, has written a letter, seeking information concerning him to Gov. Lister, who turned the letter over to Prosecutor Lundin Tuesday. Baril is about 35 years old and a year ago worked as a clerk at Woodville. Before that he worked for the Snohomish Logging Co. He is 5 feet, 7 inches tall and has brown eyes and hair.

### ROBBERS ARRIVE LITTLE TOO LATE

CHICAGO, Jan. 4.—Two armed bandits entered the offices of St. Luke's hospital Monday afternoon and made away with \$3,000, the contents of the cash box, after aving the cashier and 30 nurses, who were in the room, with a display of their pistols. As Monday was pay day, about \$2,000 had been paid to employees just before the robbery.

### REGISTER! DO SO BEFORE BIG RUSH

Registration Tuesday morning for the coming city election was 350, which was a falling off of approximately 150 from the number hung up during Monday morning's snowstorm. The total number registered up to Tuesday noon was 1,439. There are only 34 days in which to register before the primary election.

### OFF TO CAPITAL FOR CONFERENCE

CHICAGO, Jan. 4.—Frank S. Dickinson, adjutant general of the Illinois National Guard, has gone to Washington to confer with U. S. military officials regarding his plan to mobilize the entire militia of Illinois, Indiana, Iowa and Wisconsin.

### KILLED IN WRECK WHEN HE JUMPS

PORT TOWNSEND, Jan. 4.—Frank McDonald, engineer on the Port Townsend & Puget Sound railroad for the last 25 years, was killed Monday, when a construction train of the Seattle, Port Angeles & Western railroad backed into the locomotive. McDonald is thought to have lost his life by jumping when he saw a wreck was imminent.

### POLICE WINK AT GAMBLING, SAYS ATTORNEY DORE

John F. Dore, a well-known attorney, boldly charged in open court before Judge Smith Tuesday that the police are permitting gambling houses to run in Seattle without interference. "Surely," he said, "it cannot be construed as a criminal offense for a man to meet and department agents allow gambling dens to operate wide open all over the city."

Dore was defending Harry Smith, charged with vagrancy. Smith admitted that he knew Harry Field, a forger, now in the penitentiary, and Harry Dunaway, a former Northern Pacific ticket clerk, who absconded with \$5,000 several months ago.

Dunaway left a note, explaining that he took the money to pay gambling debts.

### 2 JUDGES TO SIT IN LIQUOR CASE

TACOMA, Jan. 4.—Attorney General Tanner informed Federal Judge Cushman today that he would appear in Tacoma Jan. 6 to answer the restraining order asked by the Seattle Brewing and Malt Co. to prevent the attorney general from carrying into effect his expressed intention to destroy certain of the output of the company.

Attorney General Tanner stated that he had been summoned to appear before Judge Rudkin at Spokane on the same date.

If it could be so arranged, he would prefer making the one appearance here, he said. Judge Cushman had already taken the question up with Judge Rudkin and requested him to sit here with him.

### NEBRASKA SCHOOL BOARD IN TANGLE

LINCOLN, Neb., Jan. 4.—The outbreak of the European war has precipitated a clash between the school board of Nebraska City and the district court. An old law, provisionally regarded as dead, provides for the teaching of German or any other European language when petitioned by a number of patrons. When the school board was asked to enforce the law, it balked. The case was taken into the district court, which decided against the board. The school board argued yesterday in the state supreme court.

The fact that three members of the board are of Teutonic descent and refuse to enforce the law, while on the opposite side are prominent German-Americans, has added interest to the case.

### FEAR OF FLOODS FOLLOWS SNOW

While city folks look upon nine inches of snow with a calm shrug of the shoulders, and think of it as a fine chance for the kids to have some great sport, there are thousands of people in King county and throughout the Northwest, living in regions tributary to rivers having their source at the mountains, who are apprehensive of a possible flood.

Should the weather grow suddenly warmer, and a rain melt the snow, there would be torrents rushing down the mountain sides and swelling the rivers over their banks.

This has happened in the past, and, according to engineers and Superintendent Youngs of the water department, there is nothing that can be done to head off such a flood.

The only thing that would save such a situation will be a gradual change in the weather, so that the snow would melt slowly, instead of suddenly.

Because of the frozen, hardened ground, a sudden melting of the snow would make it even more dangerous than at other times, when the ground could absorb some of the moisture.


