NEW LUSITANIA CRISIS NEAR

Washington Officials Declare Situation Again Looks Grave.

BERLIN DILLY-DALLIES

WASHINGTON, Jan. 29.—The Lusitania negotiations with Germany are again assuming very grave proportions. This was admitted by officials today.

The administration has caused Germany to understand that prompt compliance with the American demand for disavowal of the torpedoing is necessary if the Teutons desire to avoid a break in friendly relations with the United States.

Further, Germany has been informed that if her next reply shows a continued desire for delay in granting satisfaction, grave consequences may ensue.

The administration has let Berlin know that its patience is taxed over the German dilly-dallying evaded in Lusitania conversations. Ambassador Von Bernstorff has had with Secretary Lansing.

Secretary Lansing, however, made it clear today that the situation had not reached the ultimatum stage.

Concerning the report that Germany had been given until February 5 to disavow the torpedoing, he declared that "there is nothing in it."

It is known, however, that events during the past week have brought Germany and America close to the breaking point.

Admission of the gravity of the situation was not based on anything received from Berlin, but rather upon an appreciation of the seriousness of the step President Wilson took Tuesday when he rejected concessions German Ambassador Von Bernstorff transmitted a week ago because they did not include a complete disavowal.

A German embassy official on Monday said the concessions constituted Germany's "last word" in the case, but after they had been rejected, Bernstorff asserted the negotiations were not ended. Indeed, he predicted a satisfactory settlement.

IMMIGRATION FOLK GET HOME

Department Moves Into Building at First and Union.

CHEAT "PORK BARREL"

Combining the three offices in the department, which had heretofore been scattered in three different buildings, the immigration bureau in Seattle is moving into a four-story building, Saturday, at First and Union st.

With the exception of half a floor, the entire building will be occupied by the immigration department.

Immigration Commissioner Henry M. White is elated over the fact that at last the immigration station, heretofore at Ballard; the federal employment bureau, heretofore in the Liberty building, and the executive offices, heretofore in the postoffice building, are now under one roof, as they should be.

The rent of the new place is no greater than the combined rent heretofore paid.

"We now have the most modern and up-to-date immigration station in the country," said White, "and at no cost to the government or added expense in rental."

And back in Washington, D. C., Congressman Will E. Humphrey has been trying for the past few years to "pork barrel" a \$500,000 appropriation for the very same kind of an immigration station which the government now gets at no cost. Humphrey's bill still is pending.

RAYMER SENDS A LETTER

Declaring that non-partisanship is a farce, that the other candidates are performing all kinds of antics to catch the "sucker" votes, which he designates as those who belong to no party and vainly seek to "vote for the best man," Charles D. Raymer, socialist candidate for mayor, submits the following brief message for the Open Forum of The Star in the majority contest.

"I am a socialist and insist that such a thing as a non-partisan election is a farce, that the republicans will line up solid for Gill, the democrats for Erickson, and the progressives for Griffiths. They know it, but what they don't know is where the "mugwump," the man who "votes for the best man," will go. To catch this sucker, they are all performing all kinds of antics, making all sorts of pre-election promises, so soon to be forgotten.

"I expect all socialists to give me as well as the other socialist candidates their hearty support.

As for some socialists voting for Erickson as being the best thing to do at the present primary and election, such action is preposterous. No socialist worthy of the name will vote for any one but a socialist.

"MONEY BOX" MEN ARE ACQUITTED

Barney King and King Wilson, acquitted in the federal court Friday of a counterfeiting charge, were held for trial in superior court as vagrants. Testimony showed the pair had a "money box," which they attempted to sell a ranchman for "making \$5 gold pieces," but which turned out to be neither a mold nor a die.

WILL HEAR PLEA OF BILLBOARD OWNERS

Provisions in the Hanna billboard bill, said to have been framed without giving the billboard people a hearing, will be reviewed by the license committee Monday.

Sections from regulation ordinances of cities where conditions are widely different from conditions in Seattle are said by the billboard people to have been drafted into the Hanna bill.

"We have gone to a lot of expense building lattice work to connect buildings with billboards so they would not be convenient for hold-up men," said W. F. Foster, Foster & Kleiser. "Mr. Hanna's ordinance would knock this work out. The half a cent per square foot license is more than the business will bear.
