2 CANDIDATES ARE ENDORSED

Public Ownership League O. K.'s Two Men for Council

THIRD CHOICE IS OPEN

Councilman Charles Marble and Otto A. Case were unopposedly endorsed for the council at the coming primaries and election by the unanimous vote, Friday night, of the Public Ownership League.

The league also recommended the election of the third member of the council from the following list of four candidates:

Dr. E. J. Brown, R. H. Thomson, Judge W. H. Moore and Councilman C. B. Fitzgerald.

No action was taken by the league on the office of corporation counsel, both Thomas F. Murphy, one of the organizers of the league, and James E. Bradford, incumbent, having strong support with municipal ownership forces.

Candidates Answer Letters

As it was upon the league's request that Councilman Erickson became a candidate for mayor, this question had been settled several weeks ago.

Letters have been sent out by a special committee of the league to the six candidates for the council whose past record had consistently shown that they might be counted as friendly to municipal ownership.

It was upon the answers received from these six, namely, Otto A. Case, Charles Marble, R. H. Thomson, Dr. E. J. Brown, Judge W. H. Moore and C. B. Fitzgerald that the endorsements were made.

About Ballard Extension

The questions asked of the candidates plainly put the question of municipal ownership to them as a whole, and specifically on the plan of extending the municipal car line to Ballard, so as to put it on a paying basis.
