WILL TORPEDO ARMED TRADERS

German Announcement Promises More Trouble for U. S.

CRISIS IS PREDICTED

LONDON, Feb. 11.—Issues as grave as the Lusitania case may arise between the United States and the central powers, officials declared today, as a result of the Teutonic announcement of last night of intent to hereafter attack armed merchantmen.

The entente allies do not yield the right to arm such vessels for defensive purposes, a practice universally recognized.

Moreover, they do not believe that America, having recognized this right, will change her policy in the midst of the war, though she has suggested disarmament of such ships.

Authorities here believe the U. S. would take prompt and decisive action in the event that an Austrian or German submarine torpedoed an armed allied liner carrying American passengers.

Under headings like, "A New Plea for Piracy," the newspapers today declared the Germans, after seeming to yield in the Lusitania case, are embarking on a new campaign of "frightfulness," in disregard of law and humanity.

They expressed the view that the Teutonic announcement reopens the German-American dispute.

WILL NOT PROTEST NEW GERMAN PLAN

WASHINGTON, Feb. 11.—The United States cannot protest the Teutonic plan of torpedoing armed merchantmen, it was stated today, on the highest official authority. Believing that the central powers are within their rights in pursuing such a course, the administration soon will warn Americans not to travel on armed belligerent ships, it seems certain.

The American attitude toward arming such ships was set forth in the formal suggestion recently made to the allies, noting the "absence of conditions now, which in earlier times was an excuse for arming" merchantmen.

POLITICS BUZZ RIGHT MERRILY

News of Day Swirls About Roosevelt, Wilson and Hughes

HUGHES WILL NOT RUN

WASHINGTON, Feb. 11.—Spring political millinery is being hurried into the ring and yanked out again with real June fervor.

The White House, Oyster Bay and the supreme court are the gossip centers, as politicians are buzzing about new developments affecting President Wilson, Col. Roosevelt and Justice Hughes.

Publication of Justice Hughes' letter to Rep. Slamp, declaring his bat is not in the ring for the republican nomination, brought the New Yorker into the political limelight today. It is possibly the last time unless his name is suddenly sprung in the June convention of the G. O. P.

Publication of President Wilson's letter permitting use of his name in the Ohio primaries and thus definitely dropping his hat into the ring is imminent.

Declaration of Cecil Lyon of Texas that Roosevelt will accept the presidential nomination, if it comes from republican and not Southern states, added to the excitement.

Roosevelt's forthcoming trip to the West Indies, he said, is intended to provide another "back from Africa" homecoming.

Slamp's letters indicated that Hitchcock is interesting himself in a campaign for Hughes. From Hitchcock, however, came a denial today, while Hughes' reply to Slamp declared that the justice is out of the political game.

The administration drew some sunshine today from the announcement of the Nebraska gubernatorial candidacy of Charles Bryan of Lincoln, with the intimation that he and presumably his brother, Wm. J. Bryan, would support President Wilson's nomination, although opposing his preparedness program.


