

"When the boys go to camp, shelter tents, fatigue uniforms and camp paraphernalia are provided by the militia, and regular army transport wagons and drivers from Fort D. A. Russell haul the outfit free to Pole mountain military reserve, 26 miles from Cheyenne.

Sleep on Hay Mattress

The first night out, tents are pitched, wood is gathered for the cooking stoves and for evening bonfires and rain trenches are dug around each tent and around the whole camp.

Home-made, hay-filled mattresses are put on army cots. Half an hour after a halt the camp has the appearance of a regular army camp.

The mess sergeant gives the cadets assigned to kitchen work the once-over. Any particularly fresh catch is set to washing dishes or cleaning fish.

In addition to canned goods the cadets encamp with enough fresh meat to last two days. The first year they "saved" the meat until it spoiled. Lieut. Steever, founder of the Wyoming system, let them lose their beef so they'd learn by experience how to conserve the food supply.

Turn Out at 6 a. m.

The whole corps turns out at 6 a. m. After roll call and drill in But's manual, beds are made and faces washed, while the mess crew prepare breakfast. After breakfast there's an hour's drill. Then the boys play ball, go fishing, read or climb mountains. Again in the afternoon there is drill, followed by hours for recreation.

Bridge building practice and field stratagems are an important part of drill.

Night surprise attacks are an exciting feature. The first time the Cheyenne cadets went camping, Lieut. Steever took the leaders of two squads and one lieutenant into his confidence, and issued strict orders against any cadet moving from his tent after "taps."

"About an hour after we were asleep we were awakened by rifle fire," said "Hungry" Reese, telling about it.

Get 'Em Out in Pajamas

"We rolled out in our pajamas. Most of us didn't put on shoes and brought few grabbed guns.

"Lieut. Steever had hay and brush piled in front of the tents. He lit this just as squads on the rocks opened fire.

"When we were trying to crawl deep enough in a six-inch trench to escape the 'deadly' fire, the bonfire blazed up and Steever gave us the laugh and then bawled us out something fierce. It sure did get under our skins."
