REPORT SCORES GILL SEVERELY

Women's Good Government League Investigates and Reports Findings on Mayor.

GRIFFITHS ENDORSED

The Women's Good Government league at a meeting held Wednesday afternoon at the Washington Annex, endorsed the candidacy of Austin E. Griffiths for mayor. The report severely condemned Mayor Gill, as follows:

"We believe it the moral duty of every earnest minded woman of Seattle to resent this insult to Mrs. Austin E. Griffiths, one of the purest of women, best of mothers and most upright of citizens, in every way possible, and that the apology made by Mr. Gill would in no sense be considered an explanation. The re-election of H. C. Gill would be an insult to the womanhood of Seattle, a discredit to the intelligence of its fair-minded citizenship and a serious reflection upon the good reputation of the city itself.

"Vice is a real issue. The practice of prostitution, gambling and bootlegging is the cause of the revolt on the part of the decent citizens, and not increased taxation. Mr. Gill has stated time and time again that no organizer or systematic vice exists in the city, yet in the past two weeks the sheriff, with the help of ten available deputies, has arrested over a hundred prostitutes, gamblers and offenders against the prohibition law. This, despite the fact that the city maintains a force of 400 police for that purpose.

"It is clearly the duty of every person of social consciousness and civic pride, to whom the love of home, protection of children and promotion of good citizenship makes the paramount appeal, to take steps to do away with Gill and Gilliam now and forever."

CANDIDATES IN A LIVELY TILT

Caldwell, Bradford, Brown, Fitzgerald, Gill and Griffiths Get Together

POLITICAL FUR FLIES

It was a lively session at the University branch library Wednesday night, featured by several tilts among rival candidates.

Hugh C. Caldwell and Corporation Counsel Bradford went at each other hammer and tongs.

Then followed a tilt between E. J. Brown and Councilman Fitzgerald, with a little slight feature from Otto A. Case, rival candidates for the council.

Followed then a bit of a brush between Mayor Gill and his rival, Austin E. Griffiths.

Replying to Bradford's charge that his claim of friendliness for the city light plant is disputed by the fact that he is using S. E. Co. juice at his home, Caldwell said:

"In building the home where I have resided for the past eight years, I applied for current from the city light department, but they were unable to extend their system to take care of my application. I then took the Seattle Electric current. No one has ever solicited me to change, and I have made no change. I never received a cent from the Seattle Electric Co., but Bradford did before going into the corporation counsel's office. Bradford tried many cases for the Seattle Electric Co. in resisting the claims of persons who had been injured.

"If Mr. Bradford charges that I have spent a large amount of time while working for the county serving clients, it is a wilful falsehood."

Caldwell said he handled one supreme court case which had arisen before he became deputy prosecutor, and that all the rest of the cases of the firm of Caldwell & Riddell were turned over to John A. Colman when Riddell became U. S. district attorney and Caldwell deputy prosecutor.

He attacked Bradford's deputies for handling private cases and also assailed the "expert appraisers" system.

Bradford described Caldwell as "Scott Bone's hand-picked candidate."

"With his own record staring him in the face, he now cries: 'I am holier than thou,'" Bradford said, referring to private practice while holding a county office.

Discussing councilman matters, E. J. Brown and C. B. Fitzgerald exchanged words about Fitzgerald's record.

Otto A. Case, candidate for the council, pointed out that, as secretary of the Commercial Club, he drafted the resolution which called public attention to the evils of the notorious Senate Bill 46, resulting in its defeat. He said he was absolutely independent of any clique or faction.

Towards the conclusion of Mayor Gill's speech, Austin E. Griffiths came in, and Gill challenged him to answer some questions he put. Gill did not stop to hear the answers, and Griffiths characterized Gill's words as "the ravings of a political maniac."


