APPREHENSIVE OF FLOOD HERE

Rivers Full and Still Rising in the Rainier Valley District

MILLION TROUT LOST

With the Green river running full within its banks and its waters still rising, and with threatened trouble from flood in the Rainier valley, the county engineer's office Friday is apprehensive.

No serious damage has been reported locally, however.

East of the Cascades and in Southwest Washington, reports are reaching here of serious damage to farms, roads and railways.

Traffic on Grays Harbor line is being delayed by high water, wash-outs and sliding mud and clay.

The King county fish hatchery on Tokul creek was swept 100 feet down stream by the flood late Thursday, the fry troughs broken up and more than 1,000,000 small trout liberated.

Two bridges near Snoqualmie falls were wrecked. The Snoqualmie river has overflowed its banks near Tolt and is eating out large sections of roadway. Towns in the valley are high enough to escape damage, it is thought.

Nearly 1,000 feet of Northern Pacific track in the Yakima river canyon, between North Yakima and Ellensburg, are reported out. Officials of the road said repairs would be complete by noon Friday.

Ellensburg is flooded under two feet of water, and families have moved to higher ground.

Bellingham is partially under water. Lake Whatcom is reported to have risen three inches in 48 hours.



GERMS ON PENCILS

Of the 50,000 school children in this country who are the annual victims of preventable disease, there is no doubt but that a goodly per cent of them contracted disease from the habit of sucking the points of pencils passed from hand to hand.



To prevent this transmission of deadly germs of preventable diseases a new device has just been invented.

It is a specially constructed rack upon which pencils collected from the children can be placed with the tips resting in sockets where they are acted upon by a formalin gas disinfectant, which kills all germs.

To get the best and safest results two sets of pencils should be kept on hand. While one set is in use the other can be undergoing disinfection, thus by changing pencils twice a day the danger of the spread of germs can be cut in half.

BELT LINE FAVORED BY 67 PER CENT VOTE

Altho the port's belt line proposition was favored by 57 1/2 per cent of the voters, it failed to pass, because the law required approval of 60 per cent. The total vote was 33,675 votes for proposition No. 1, to transfer \$285,000 for the construction of the belt line. The vote against this totaled 24,629.

The other two propositions for improvements of the north and south shores of Lake Union, also were defeated for lack of 60 per cent vote. The vote stood: Proposition No. 2—for, 31,247; against, 22,769; proposition No. 3—for, 31,247; against, 22,533.
