HOME SICK; ENDS LIFE

Too Much Orient Causes Officer's Act

"Too much Orient" is believed today to have influenced young Lieut. Ormand C. Pailthorpe to step into his ward room aboard the U. S. S. Saratoga, at Bremerton, Friday, close the door and send a bullet thru his heart.

Friday morning the young engineer officer ate breakfast with the other officers aboard ship, chatted and laughed, read the newspapers and went below about 10:30, to do some work in the engine room.

He was a tall, freckled, good-natured fellow, respected for his efficiency. He didn't force friendships or dabble in the station's social whirl.

He joked with his men 20 minutes before he died.

At 9 o'clock he went into his quarters and closed the door. Half a minute later the crack of his Colt's revolver was heard.

Officers and men went running toward the sound.

They opened the door and saw Pailthorpe lying dead on the floor.

Brother officers maintain that the reason for the suicide will have to be sought outside Pailthorpe's naval record, his work, and his small circle of friends.

"We're dumfounded," was the way Surgeon Zaleski, stationed aboard the Saratoga, and a member of the specially appointed board of inquiry, expressed it. "Pailthorpe wasn't married and had no interest in any woman that I know of. His health was perfect. He kept to himself more than most officers, but he wasn't morbid."

"He had been out on duty on the Asiatic station for six years. He was sent out on the Pompy after graduating from the naval academy in 1910, and he was hungry to get back to his home, in Potoskey, Mich."

"Last July he was transferred to the Saratoga, and finally got back here to the navy yard in February. Saturday the body of Pailthorpe and all the men, the surgeon said, wanted to get home."

Most of them did. Pailthorpe was the one who had to stay with the ship. He was expecting leave, but week after week had dragged by and it hadn't come.

Saturday the body of Pailthorpe was sent to his parents at Potoskey, Mich. He was 25 years old.

T. R. BACK IN N.Y. COURT UPHOLDS

MUM ON MEXICO THE INITIATIVE

NEW YORK, March 25.—For the present, Theodore Roosevelt is willing to talk only of natural history, and not on any of the stirring events in Mexico or elsewhere. The former president and Mrs. Roosevelt arrived on the steamer Quaker from the West Indies last night and announced the discovery in Trinidad of a bird new to him. He said it was as big as a barn owl, lives in caves, stays awake nights, and eats nuts.

He warned a reporter against "nature fishing" when he was asked if the bird "barked like a dog."
